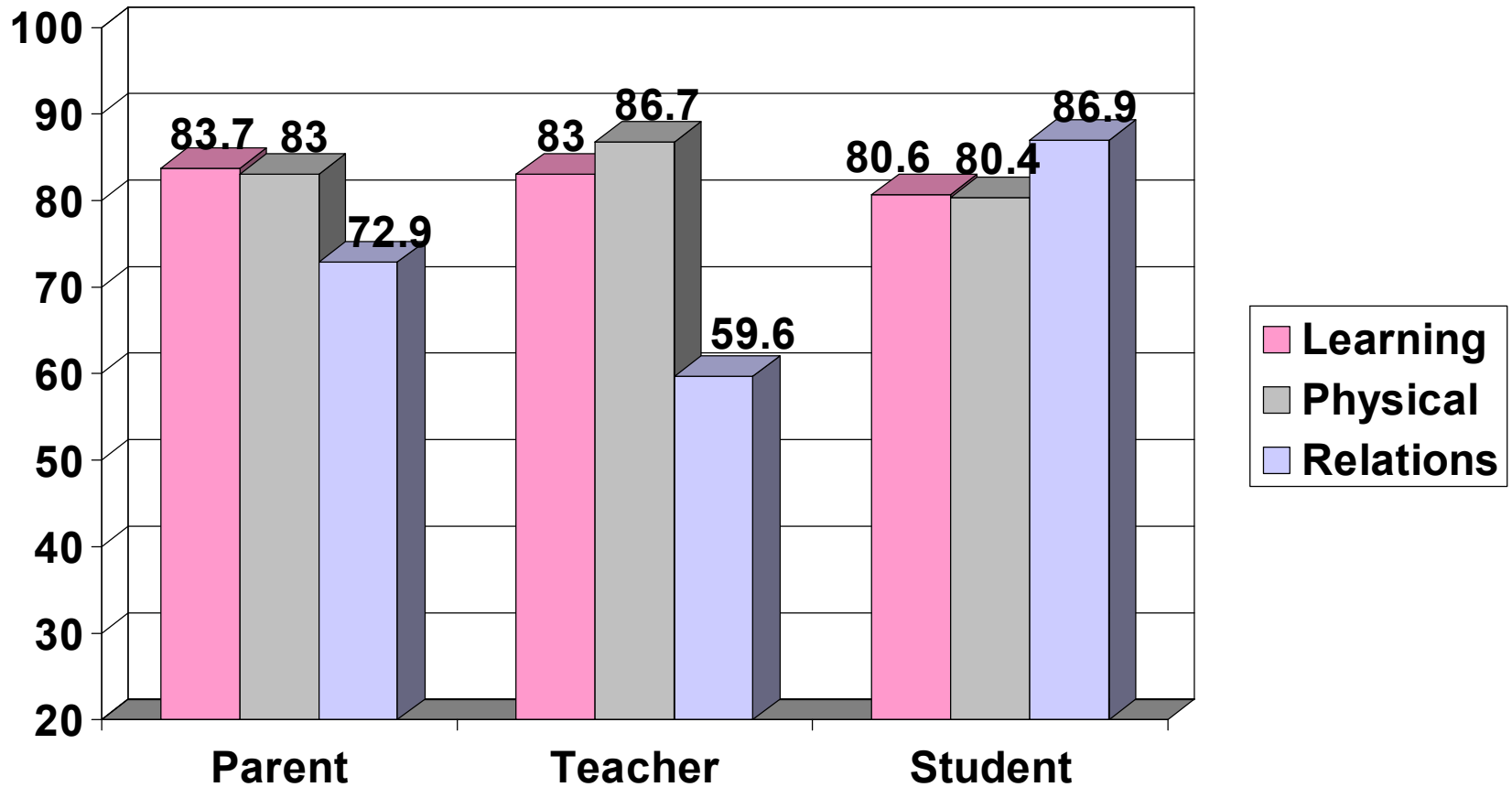


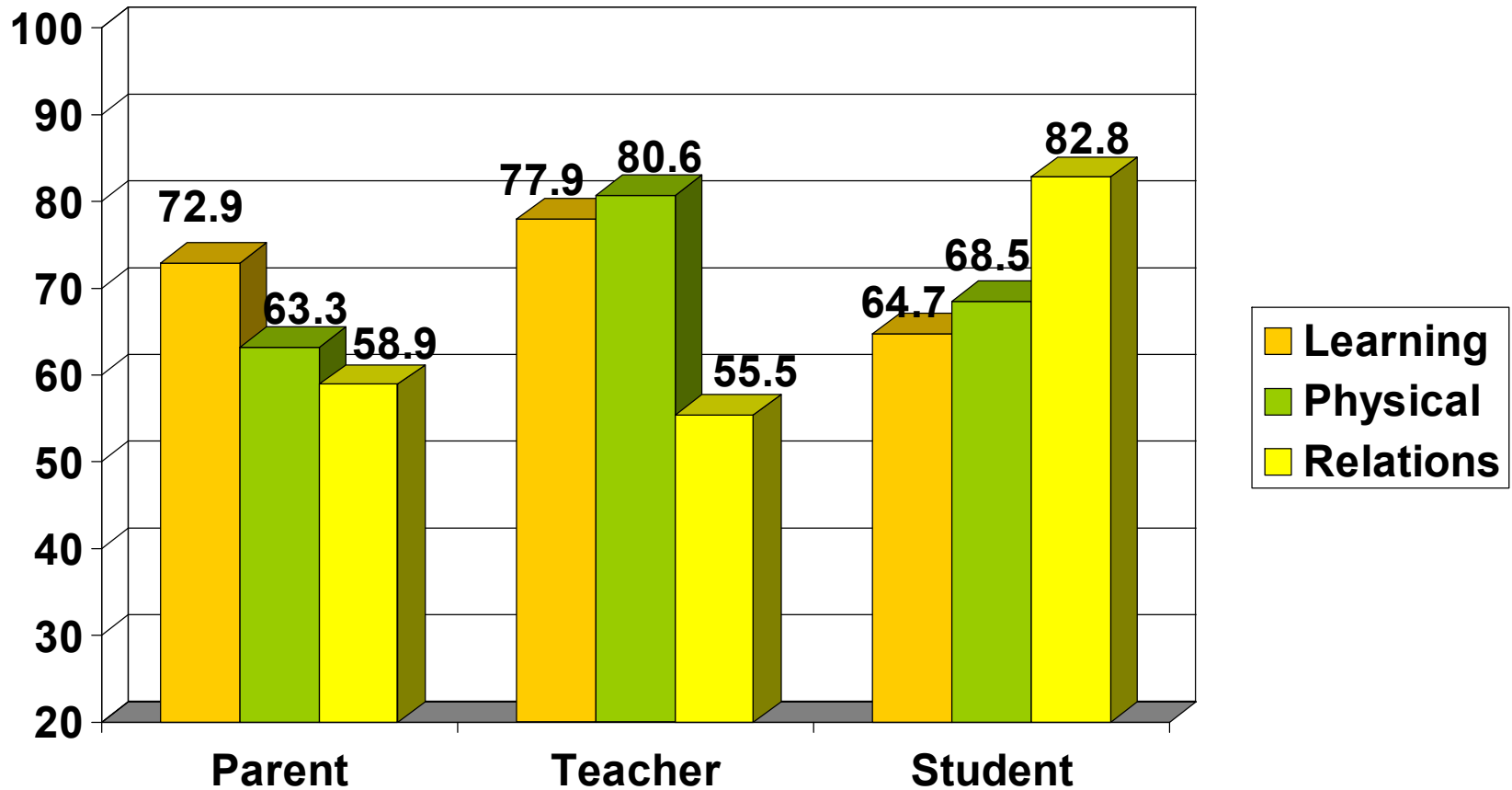

Elementary Level



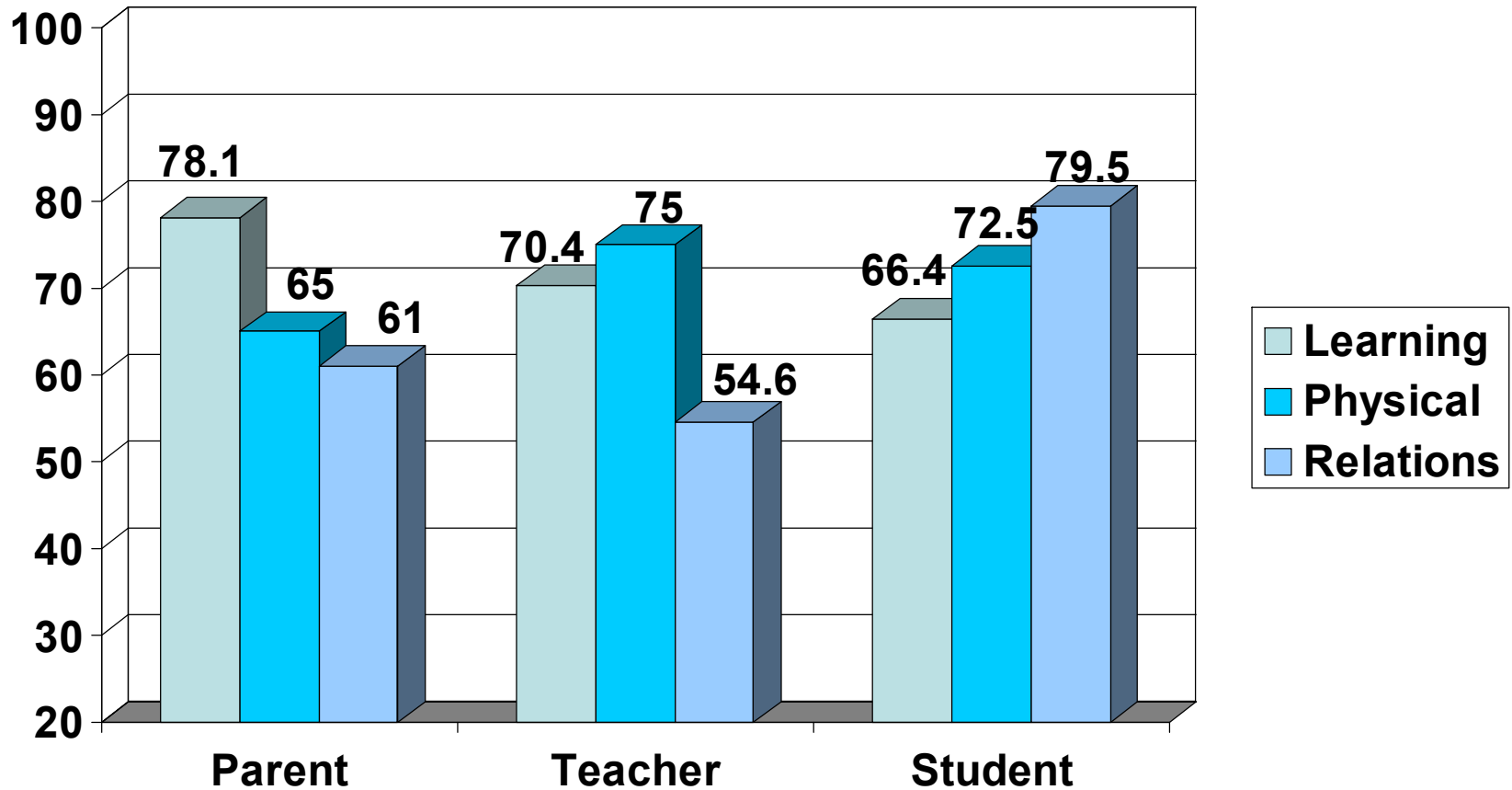

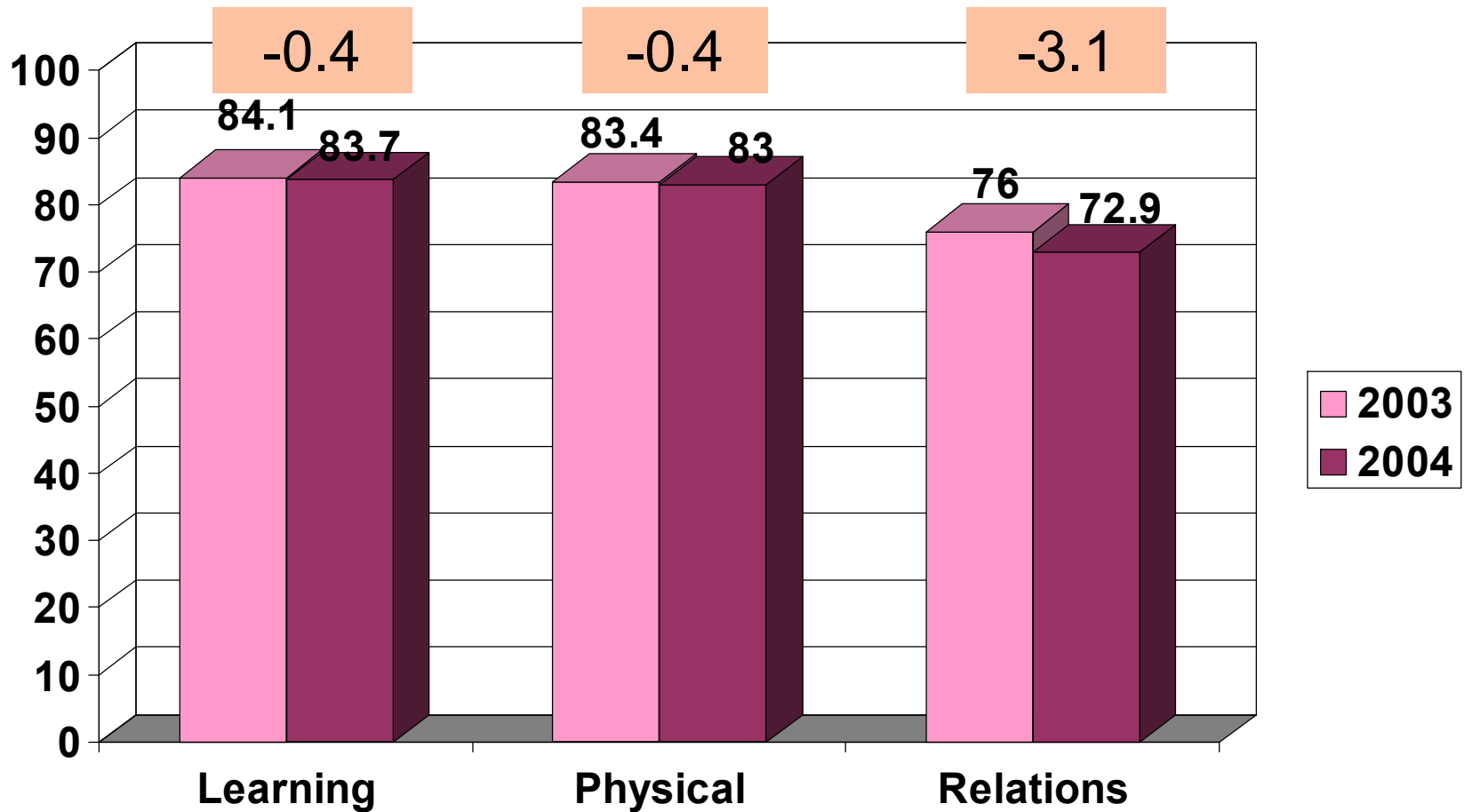
Summary

- Across levels, parents **most satisfied** with the Learning Environment; teachers with the Social and Physical Environment, and students with the Home-School Relations.
- Across levels, parents and teachers **least satisfied** with the Home-School Relations while students least satisfied with the Learning Environment.
- Across levels, teachers were most frustrated with Home-School Relations (ele: 59.6%, Mid: 55.5%, high: 54.6%)

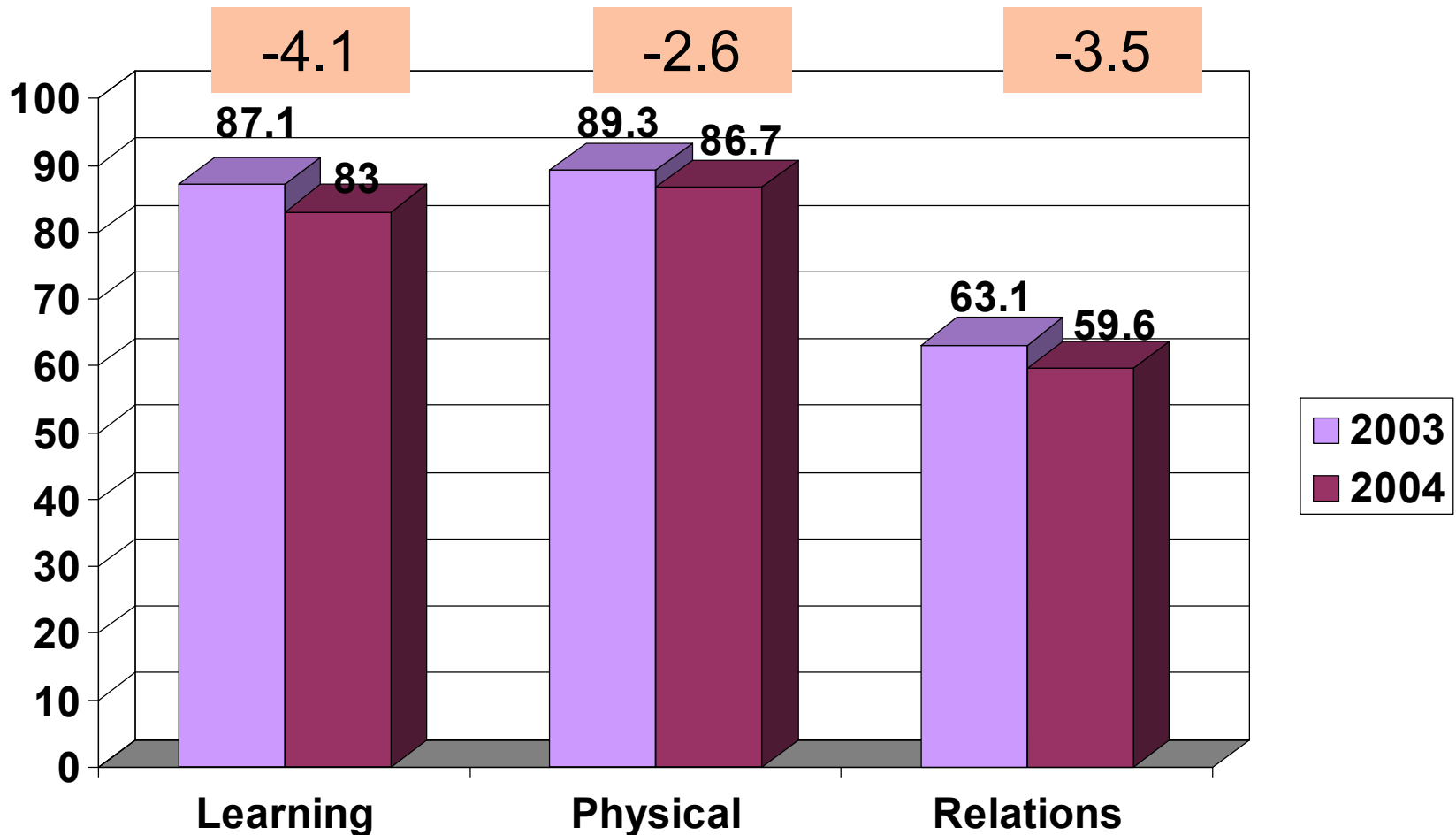
Summary

- Across surveys, elementary level responses were more positive than those of middle and high school levels.
- Except for parent survey results, the responses at middle school level were more positive than that of high school level.

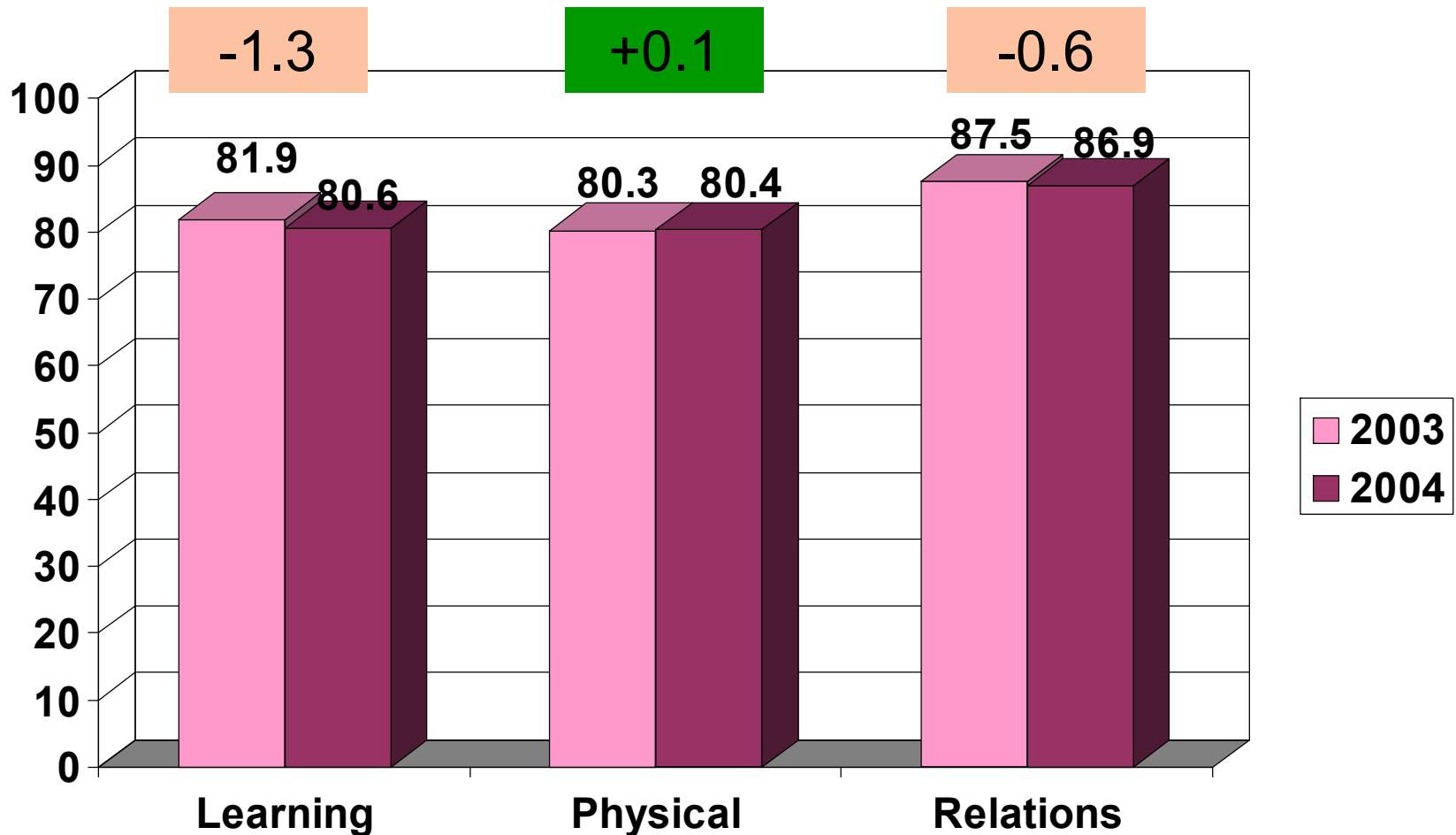
2004 Parent Survey Results Elementary Level



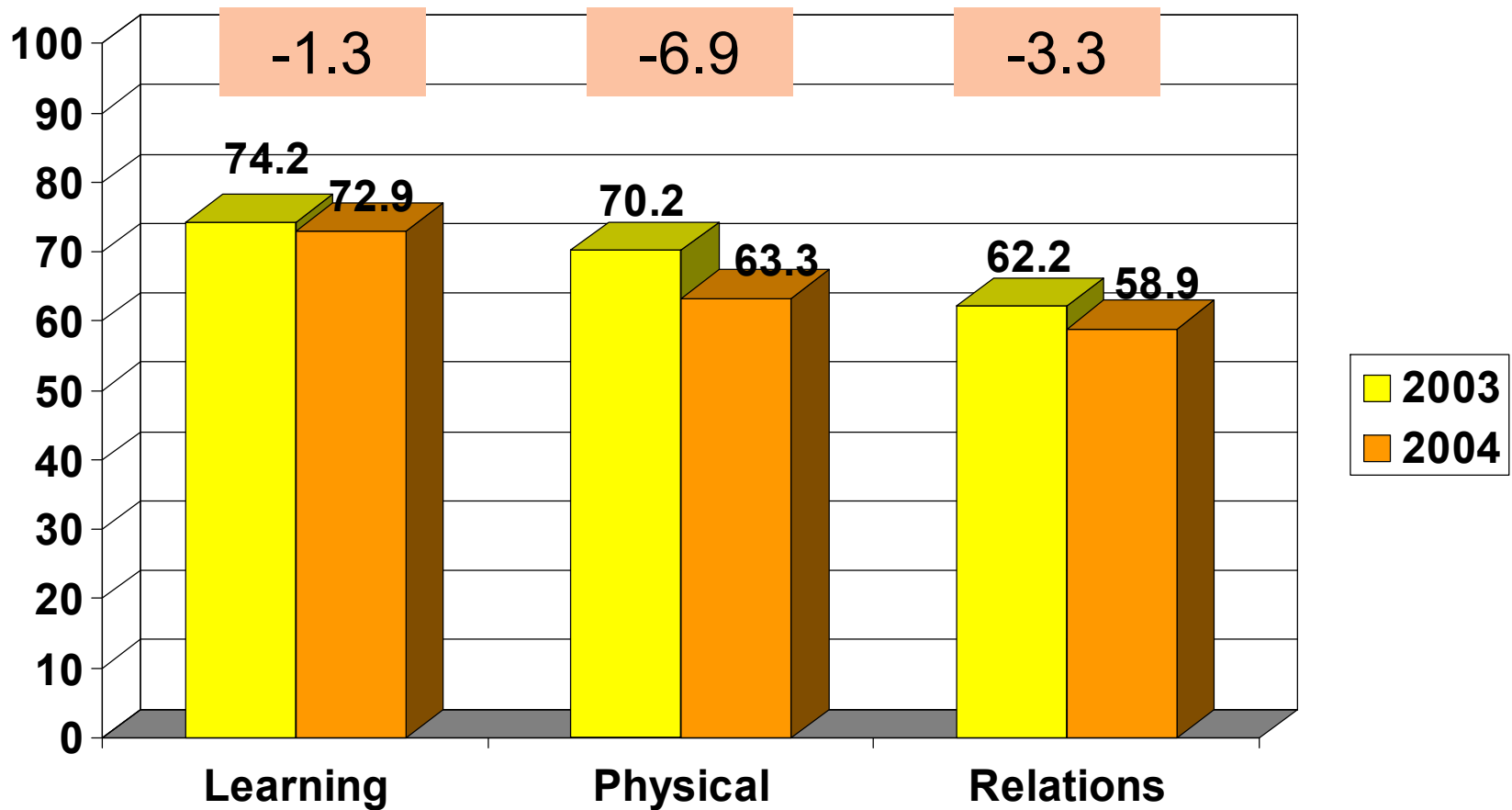
2004 Teacher Survey Results Elementary Level



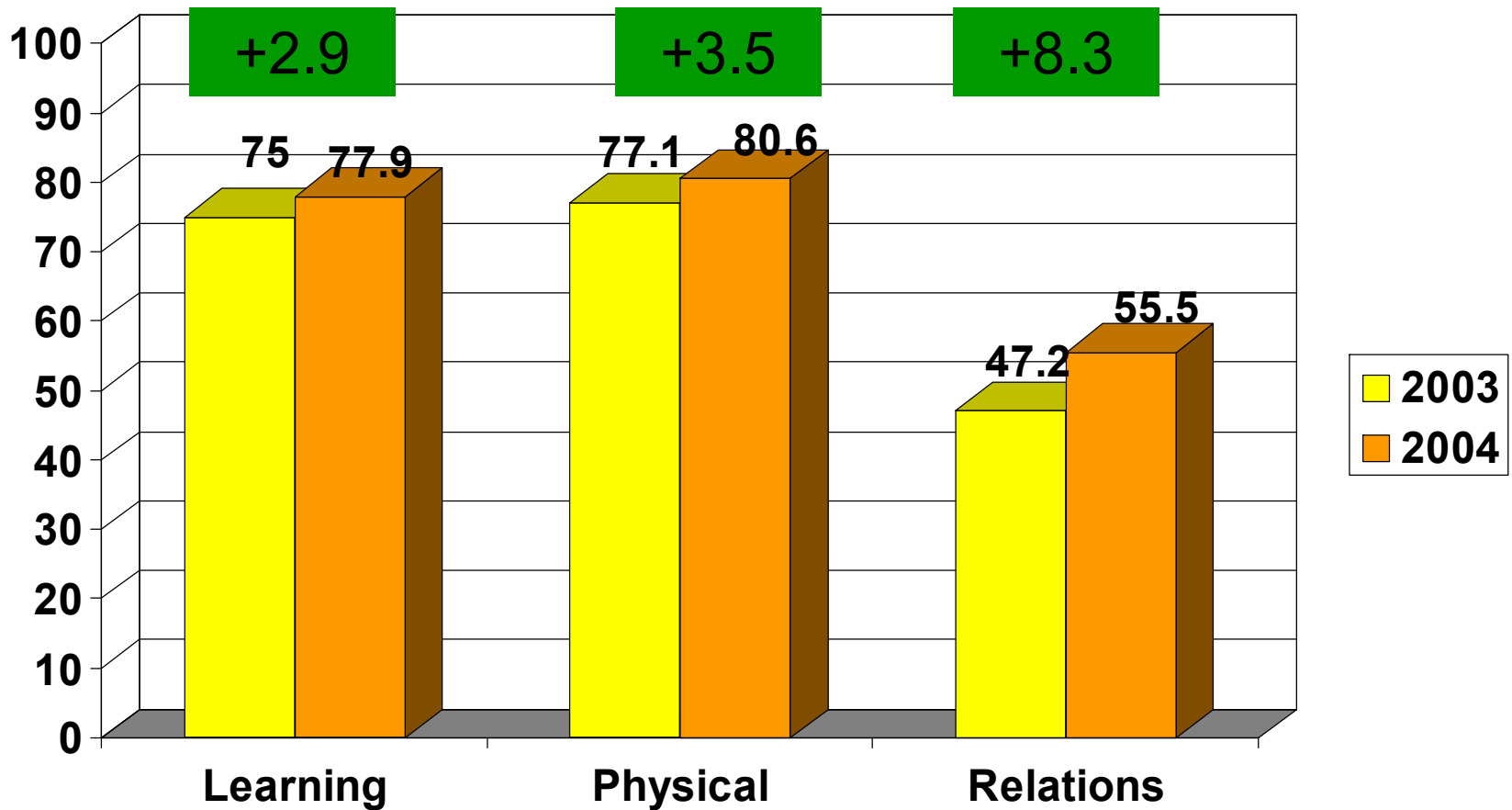
2004 Student Survey Results Elementary Level

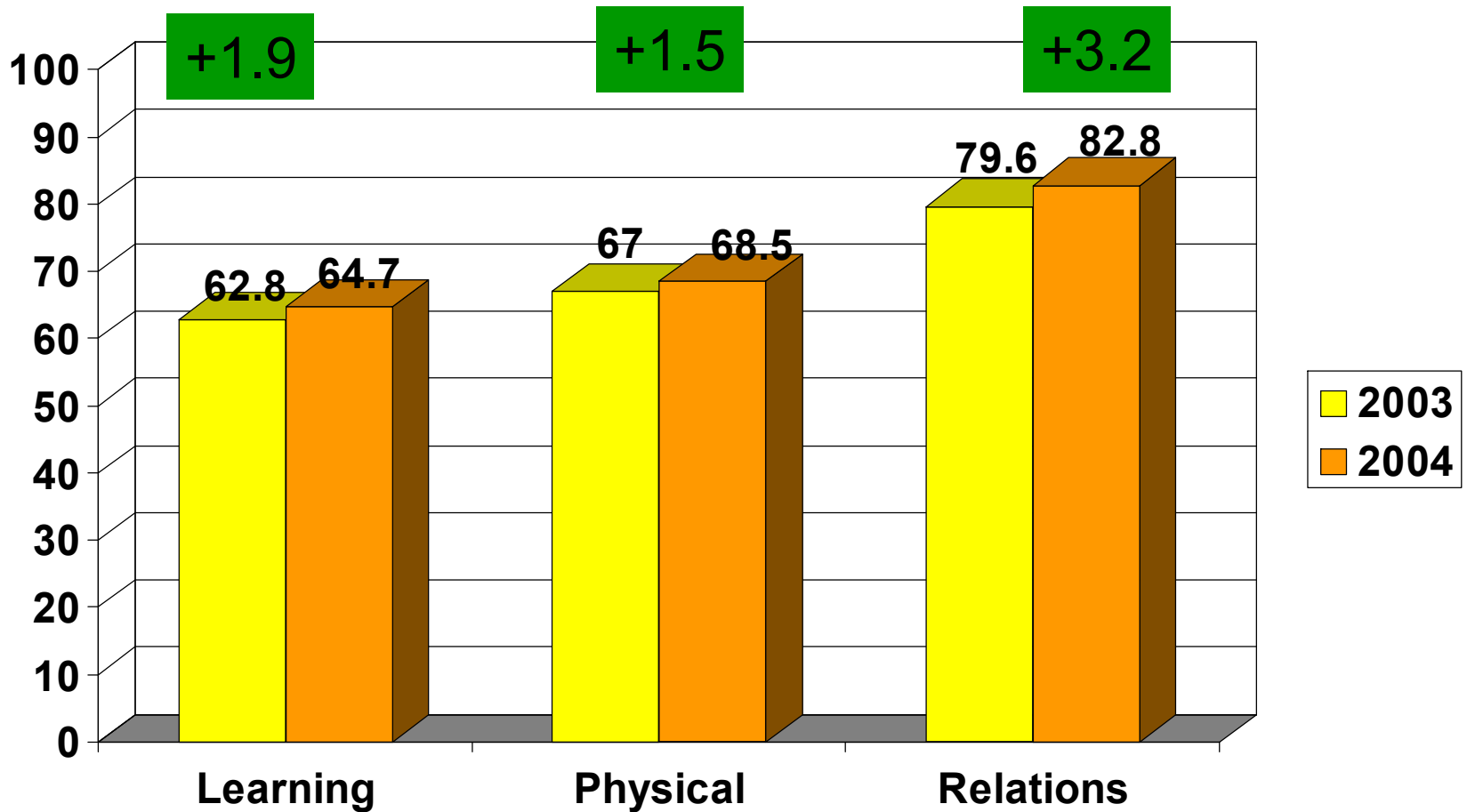

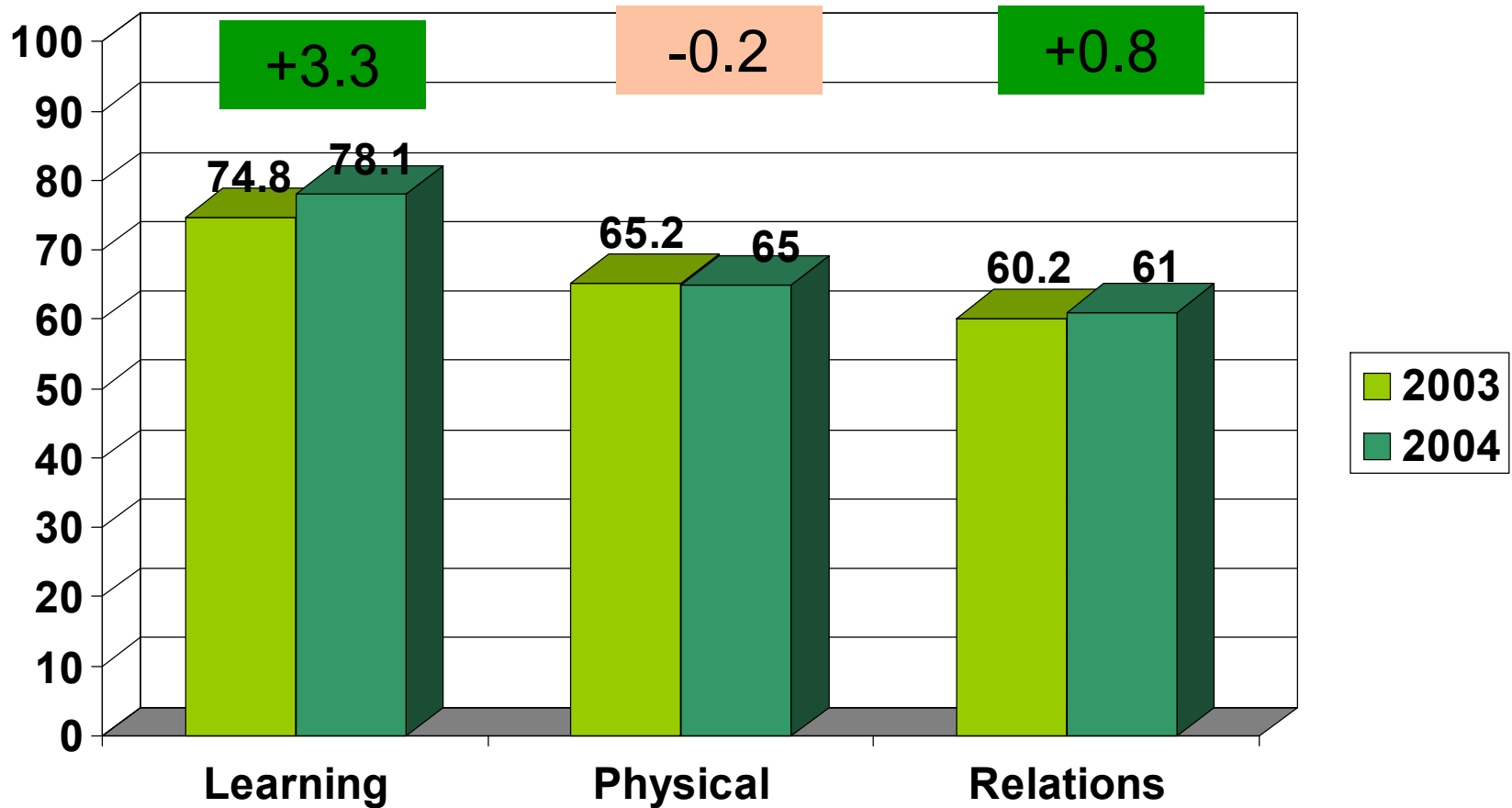

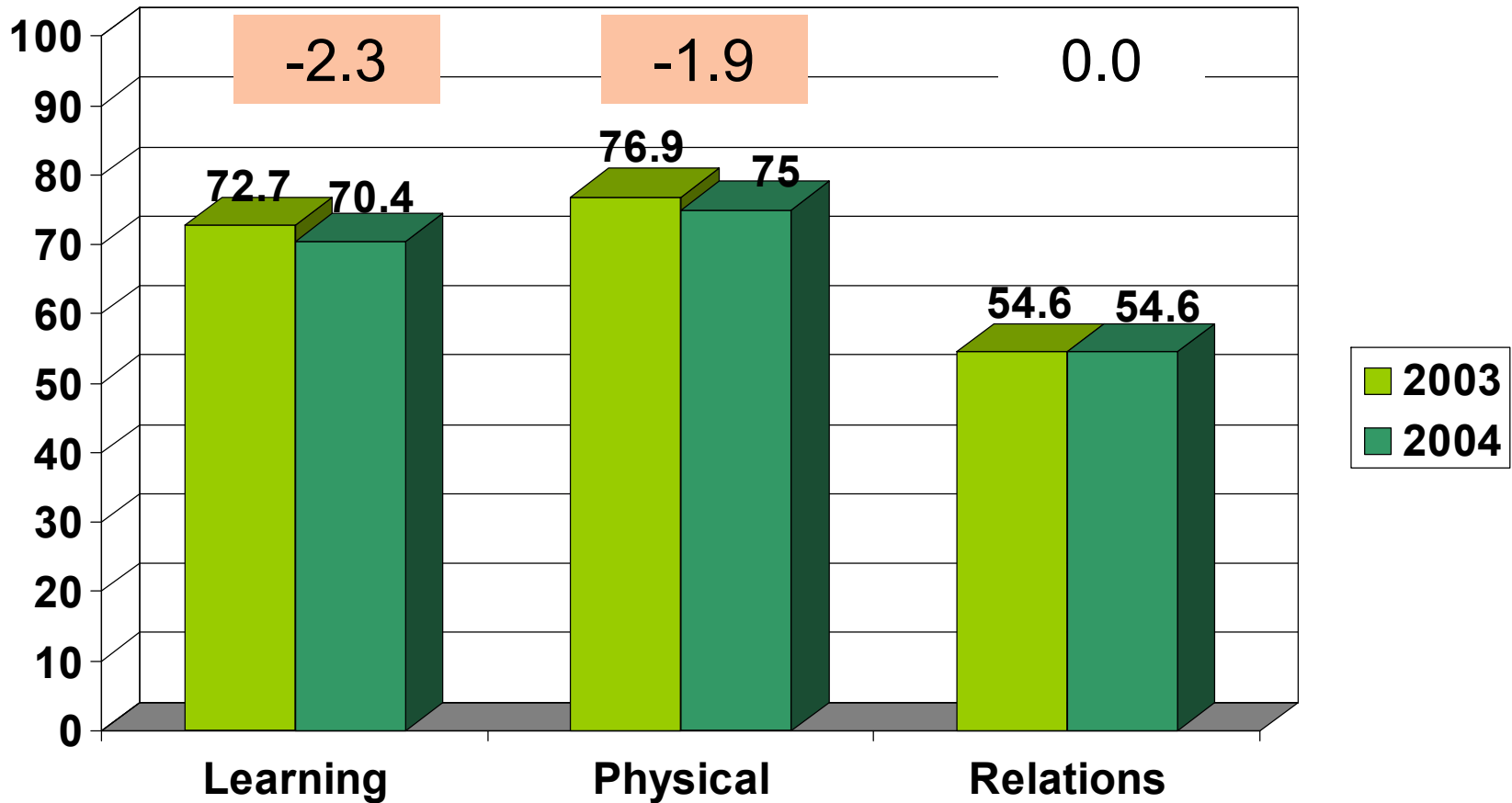

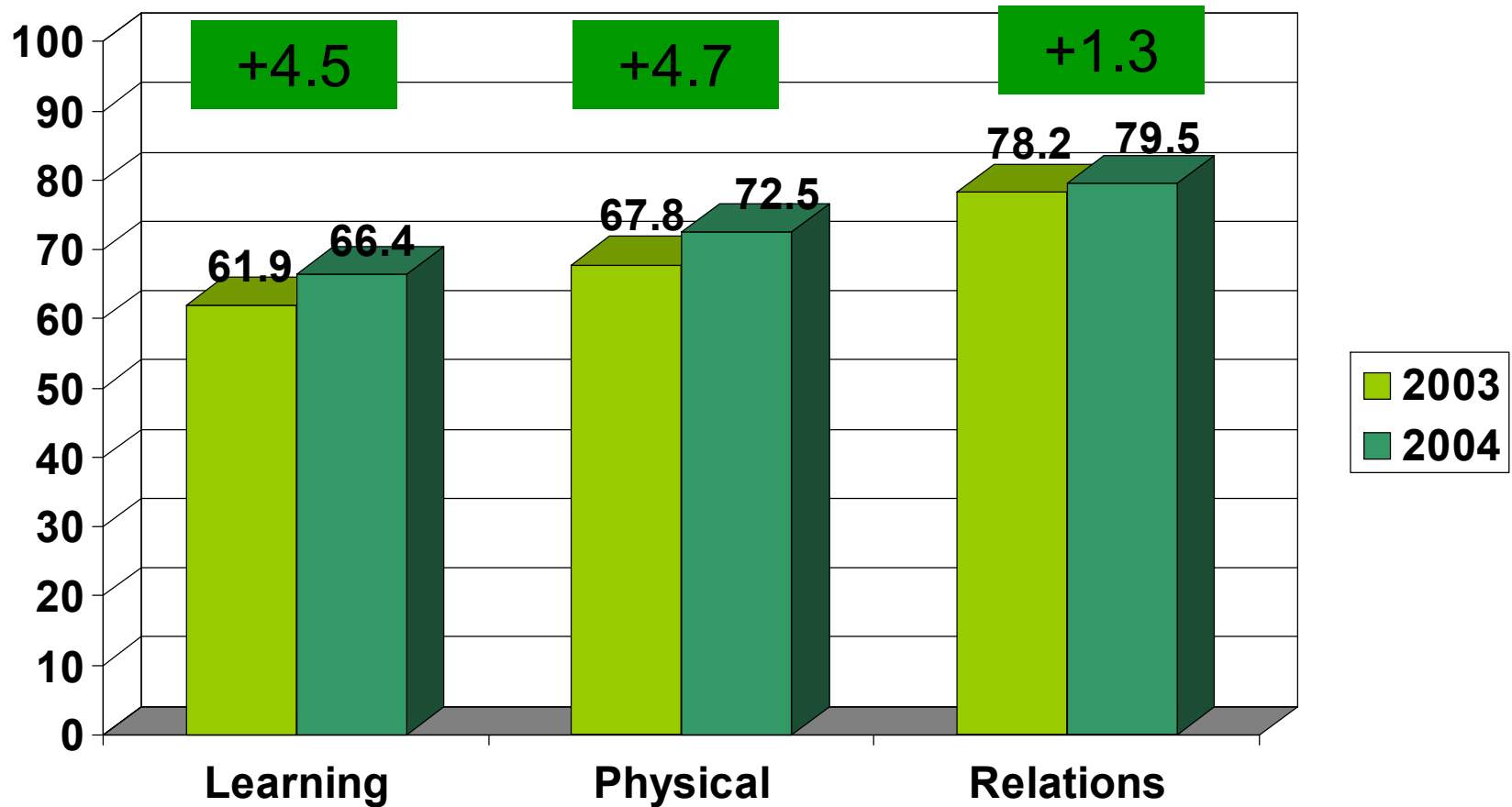

Summary of Two-Year Results

- At elementary level, the responses of 2004 were generally less positive than those of 2003, especially teacher responses.
- At middle school level, the teacher and student responses of 2004 were generally more positive than those of 2003, especially teachers'.
- At high school level, the student responses were more positive in 2004 than 2003.
