# EOC Surveys

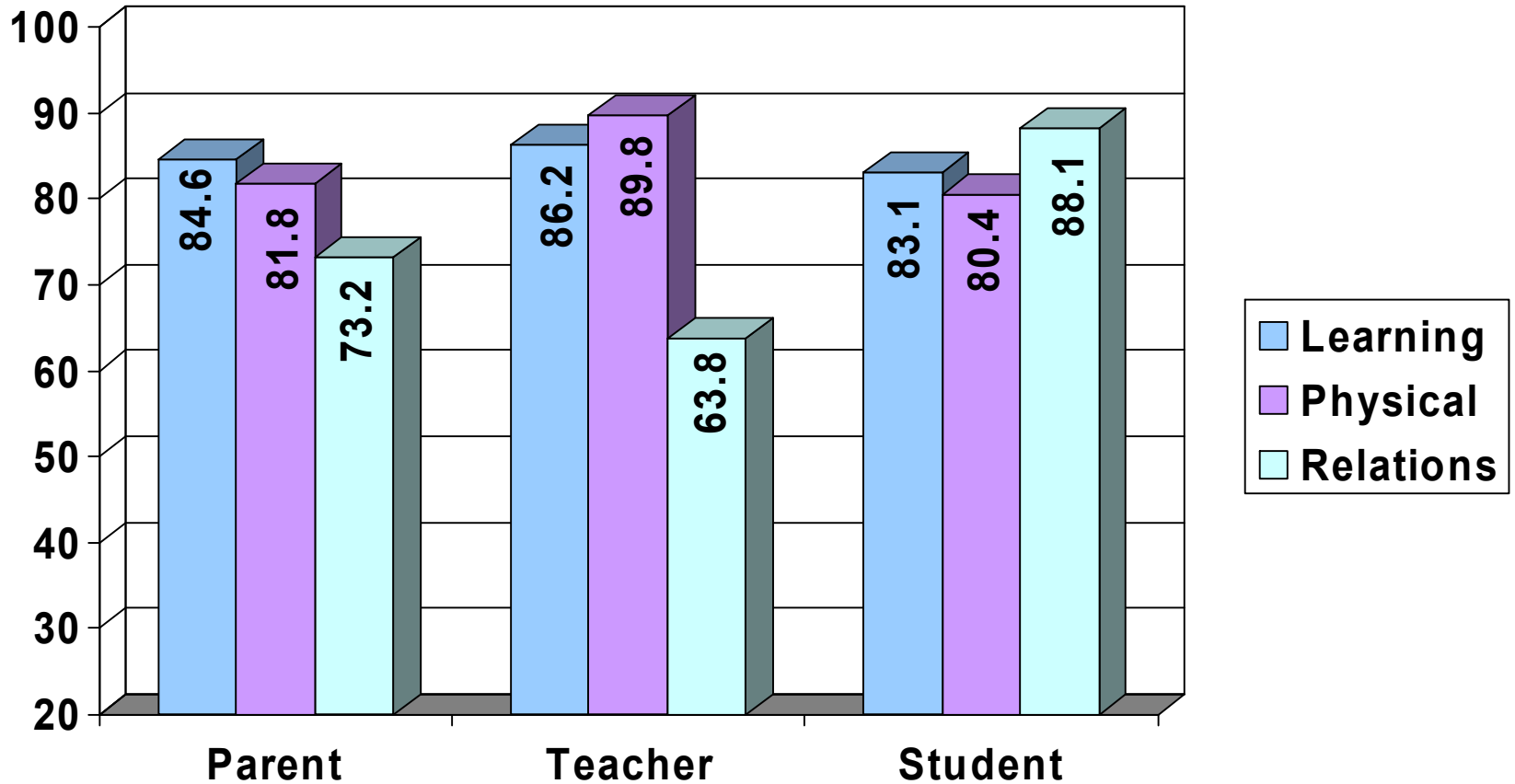
1. Parent surveys contain 46 questions, soliciting perceptions about schools and parent activities.
2. Teacher surveys contain 53 items, soliciting perceptions about schools, leadership, and disciplines.
3. Student surveys contain 43 items (44 for high schools), soliciting perceptions about schools, teachers, and disciplines.

2. I am satisfied with the **SOCIAL** and **PHYSICAL** environment at my school.
3. I am satisfied with home-school **RELATIONS**.

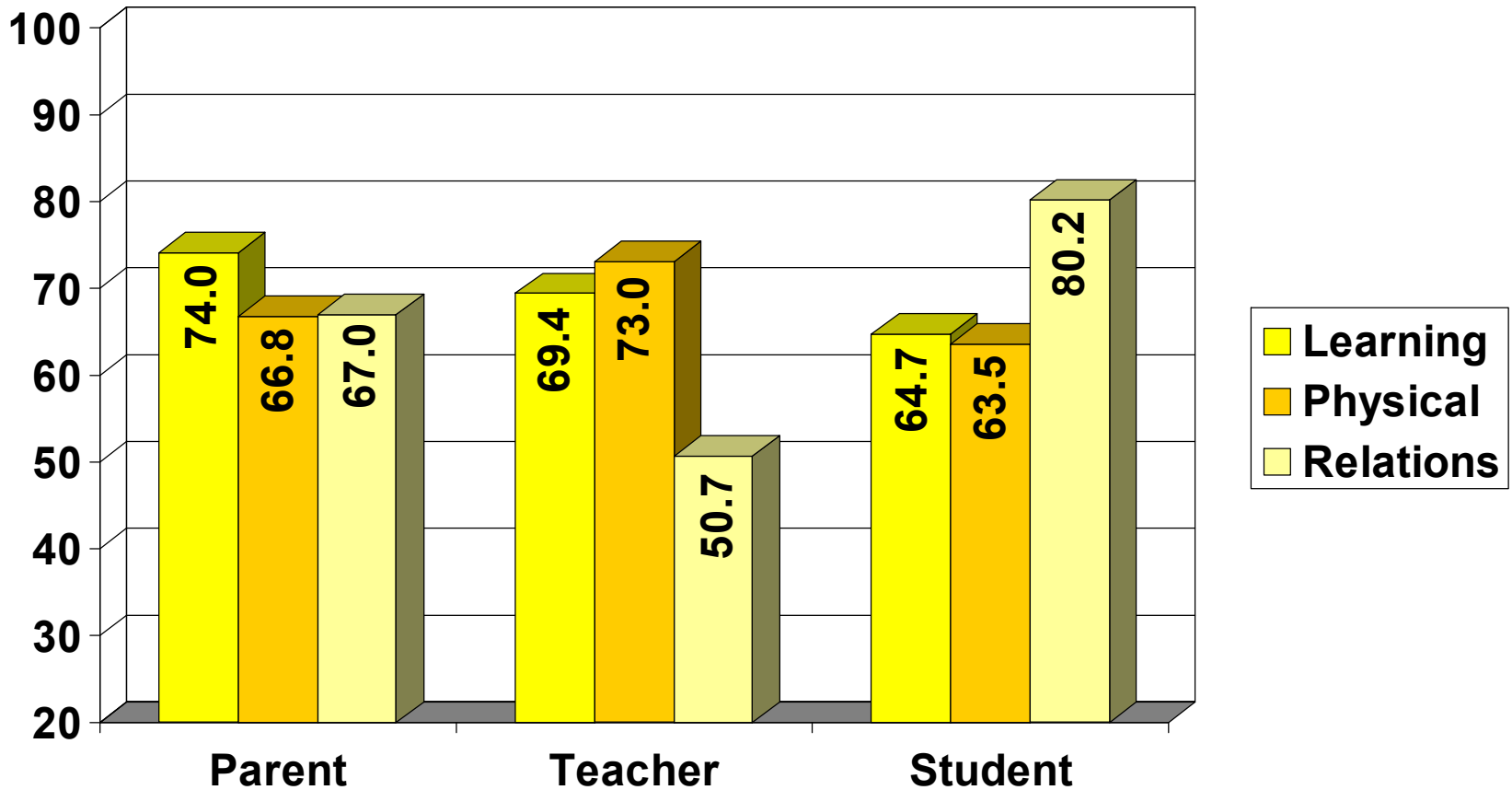

## Elementary Level



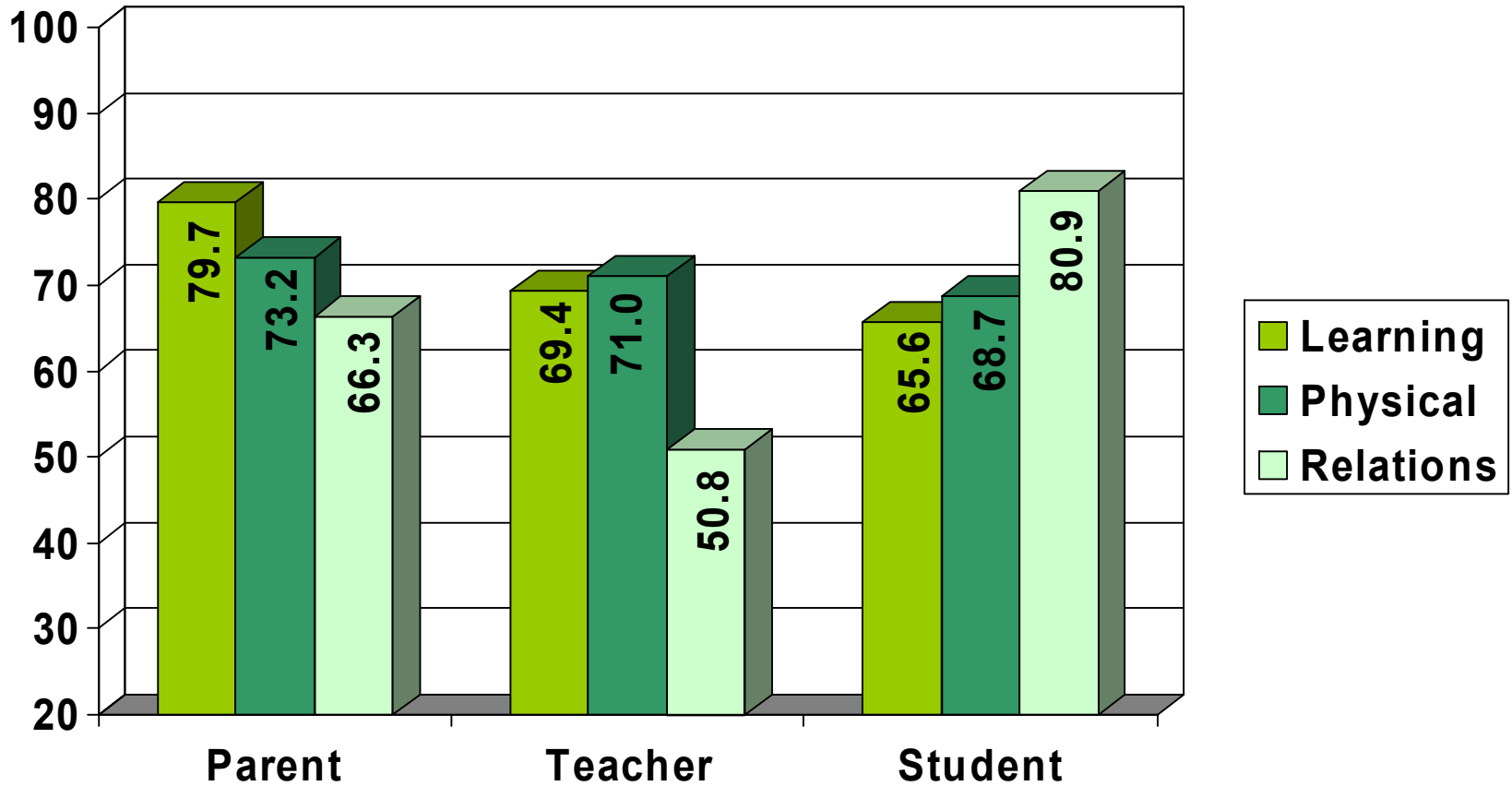

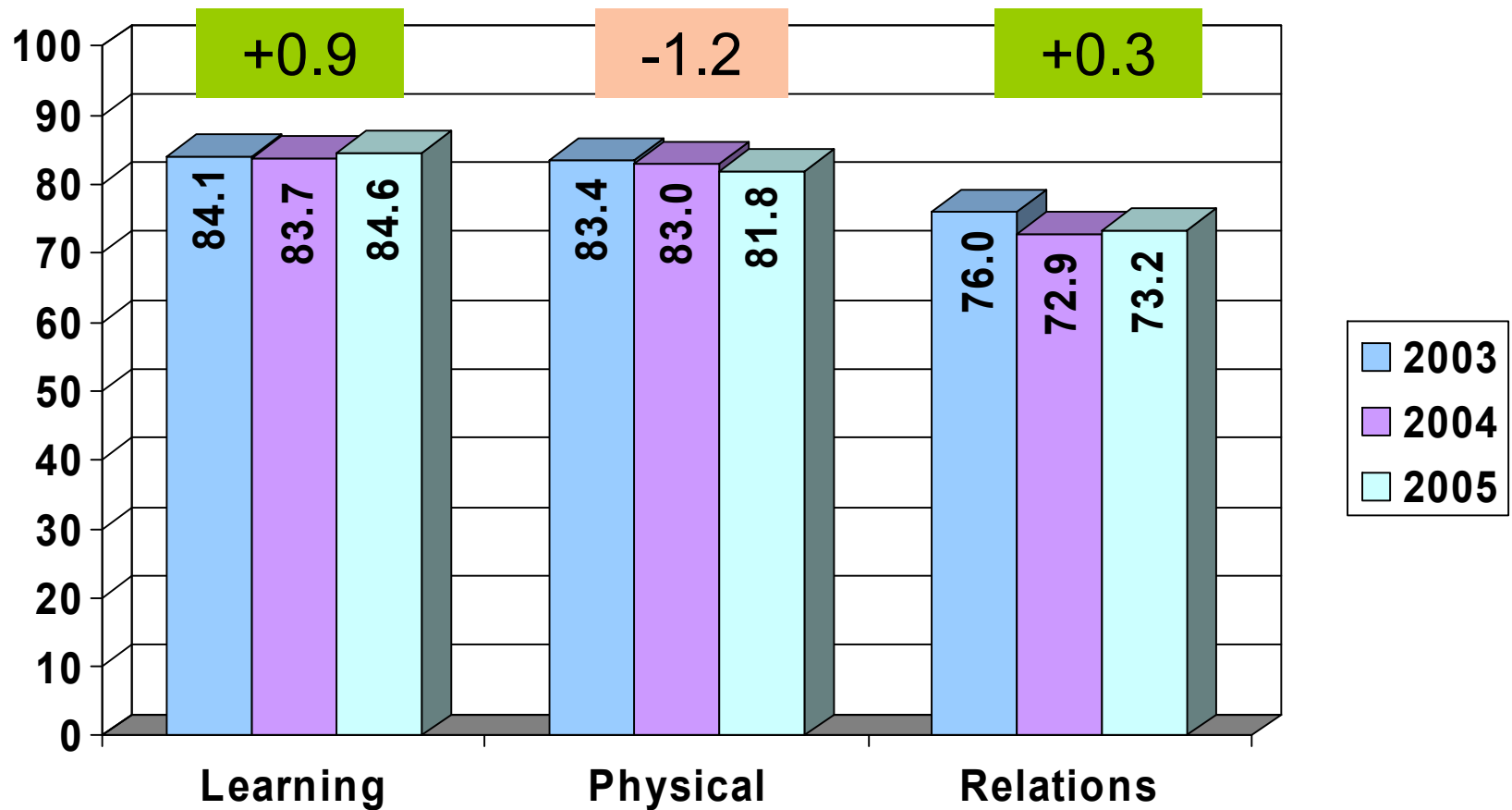
# Summary

- Across levels, parents **most satisfied** with the Learning Environment; teachers with the Social and Physical Environment, and students with the Home-School Relations.
- Across levels, parents and teachers **least satisfied** with the Home-School Relations while students least satisfied with the Learning Environment.
- Across levels, teachers were least satisfied with Home-School Relations (ELE: 63.8%, MID: 57.1%, HIGH: 50.8%)

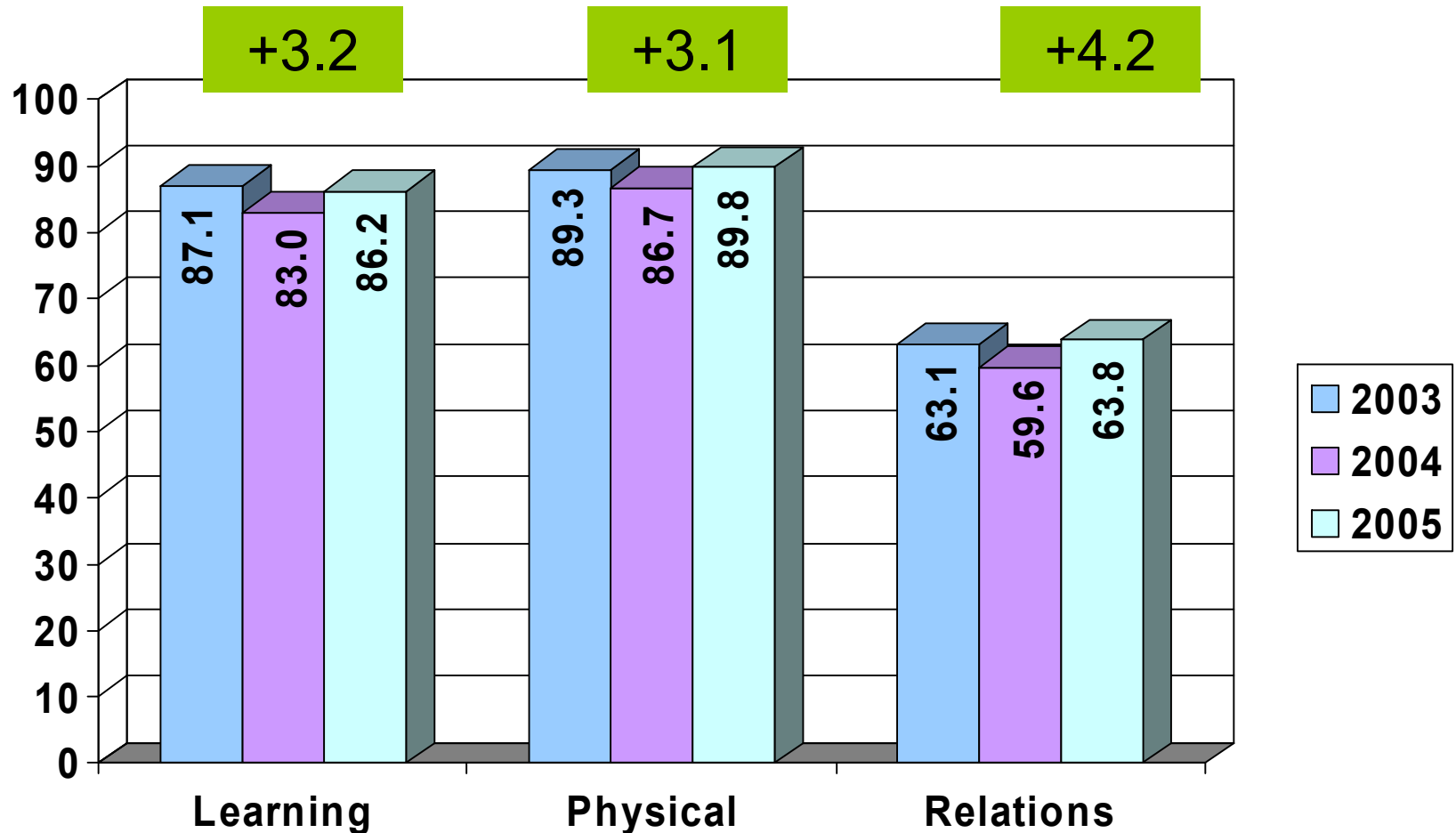
# Summary

- Across surveys, elementary level responses were more positive than those of middle and high school levels.
- The responses at high school level were generally more positive than those of middle school level.

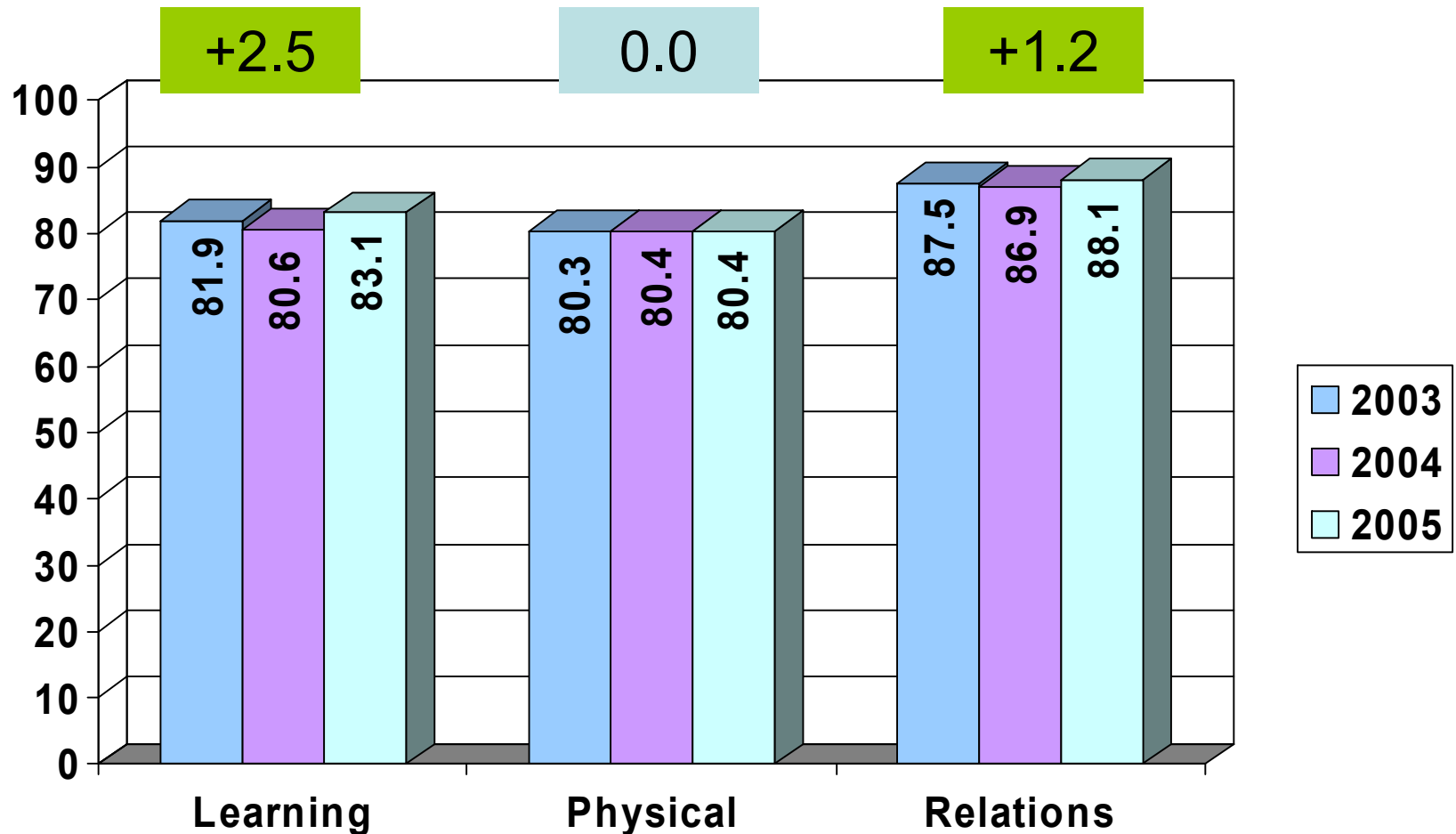
# 2005 Parent Survey Results Elementary Level



# 2005 Teacher Survey Results Elementary Level

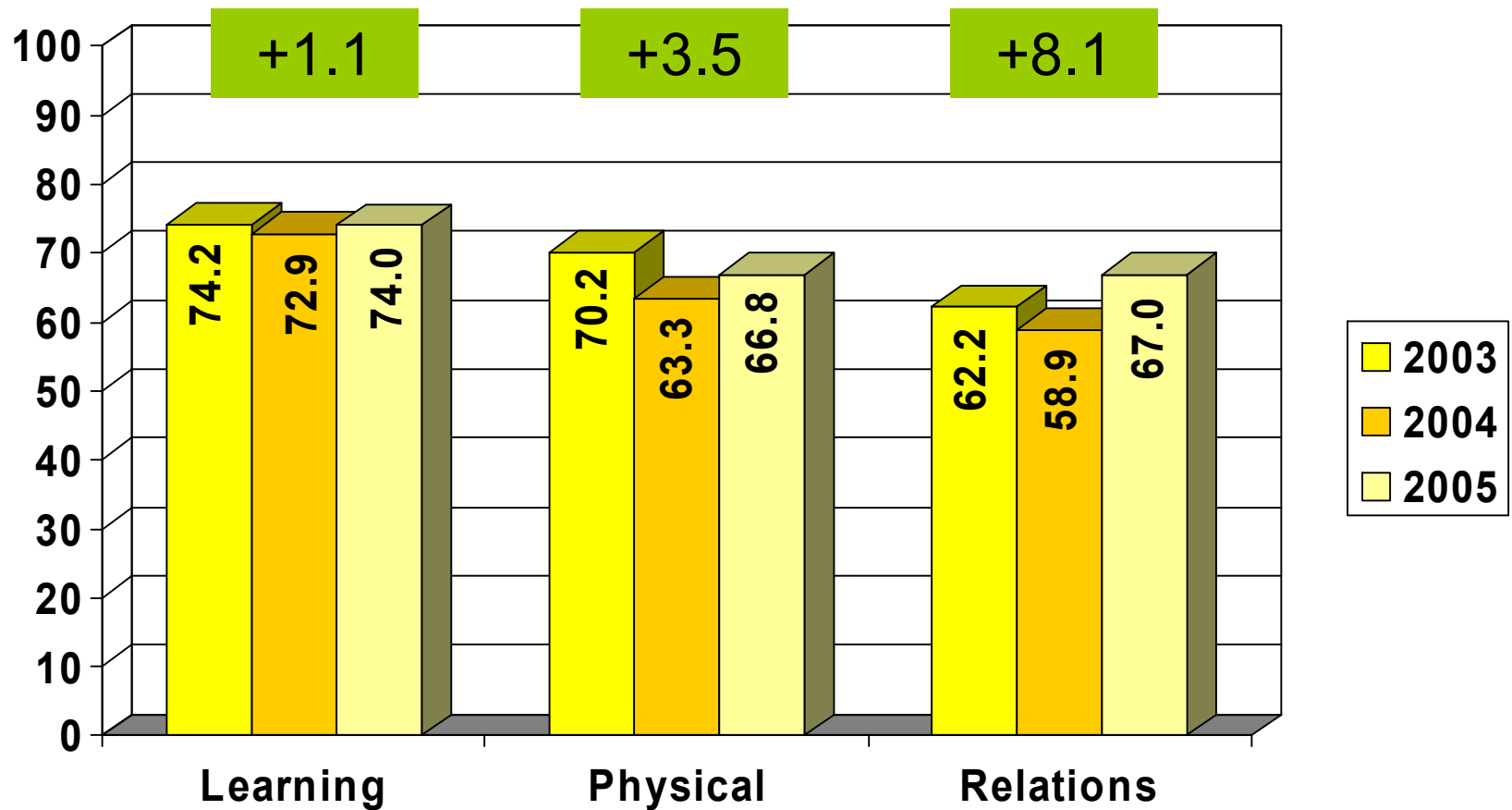


# 2005 Student Survey Results Elementary Level

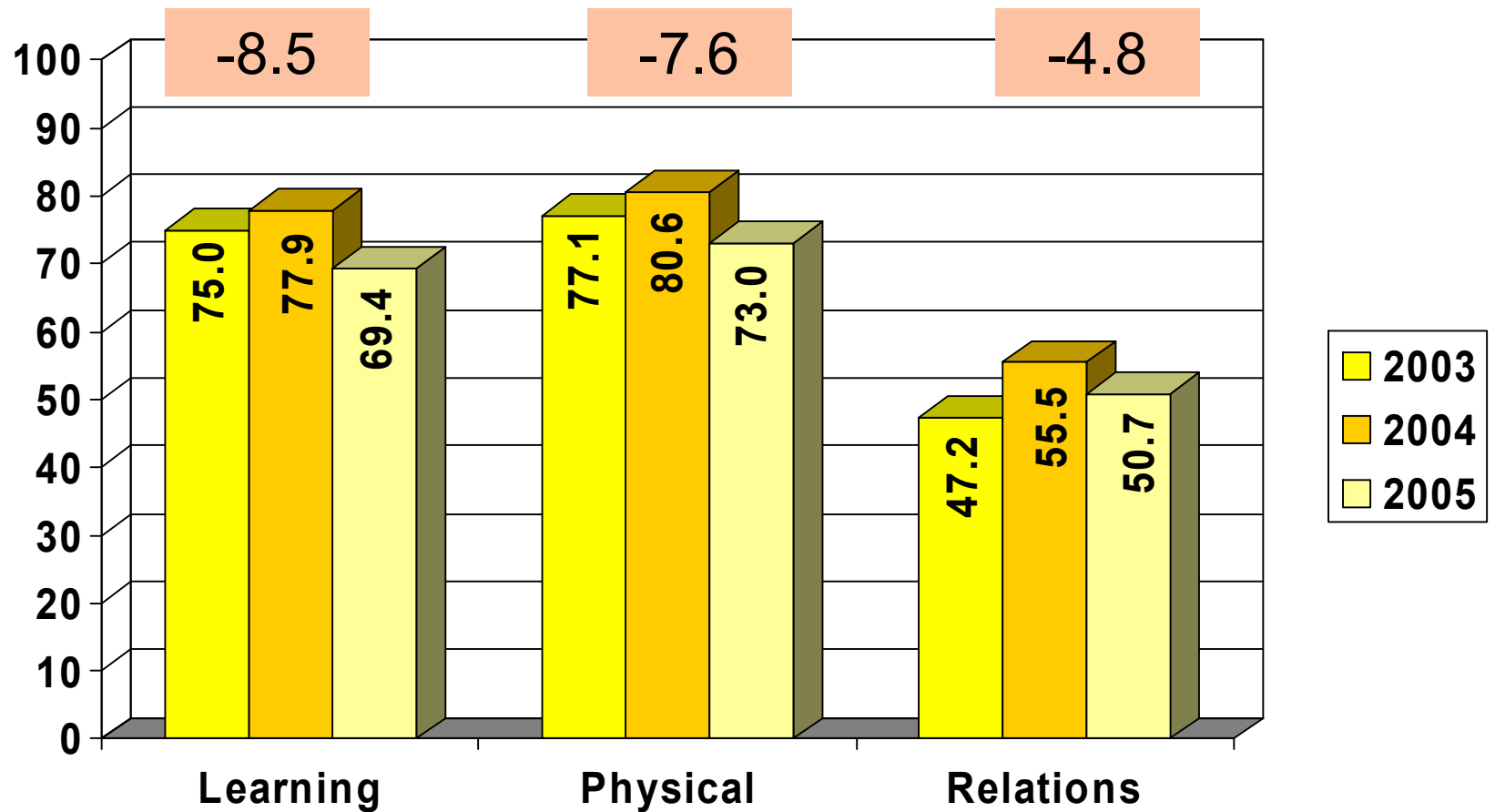

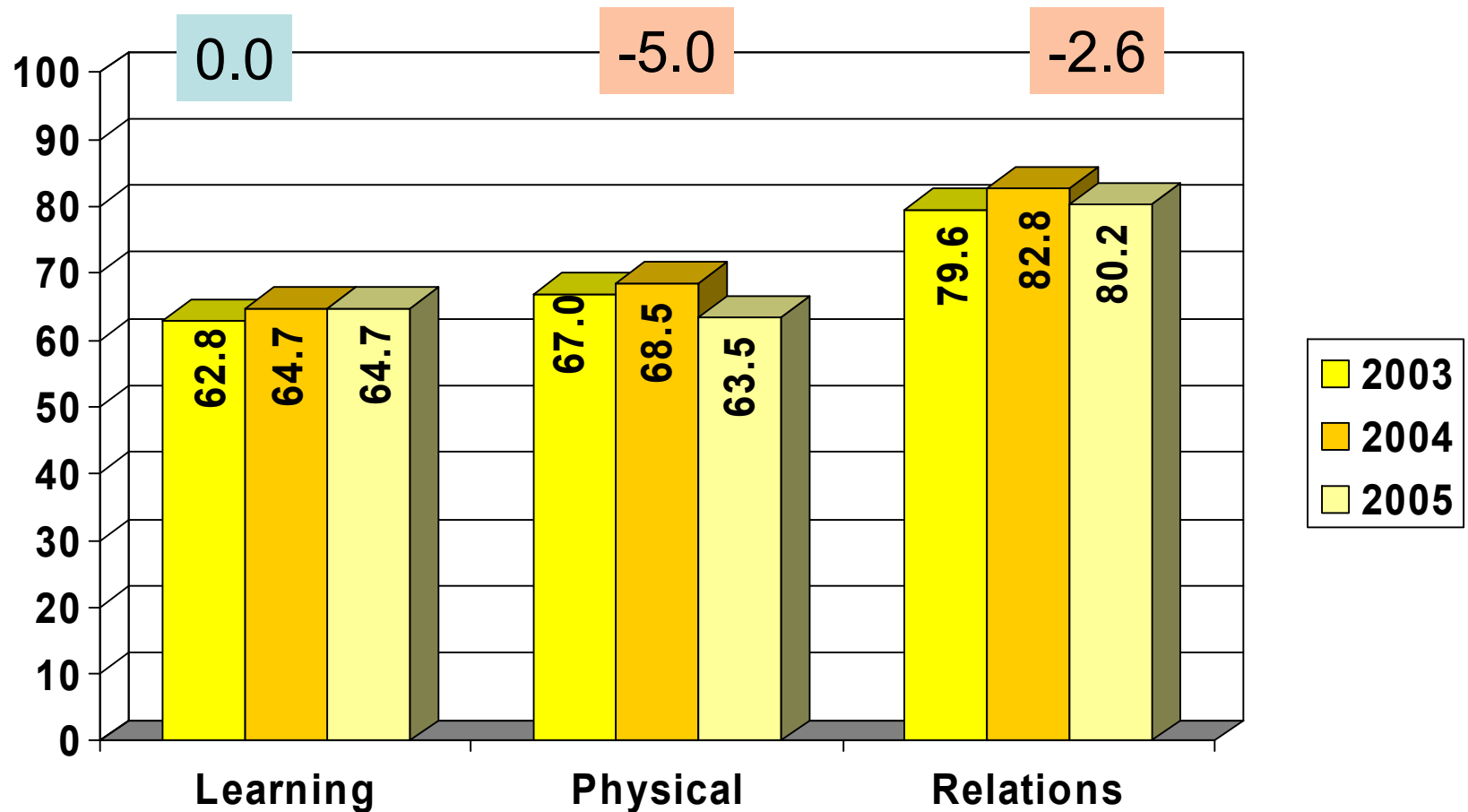

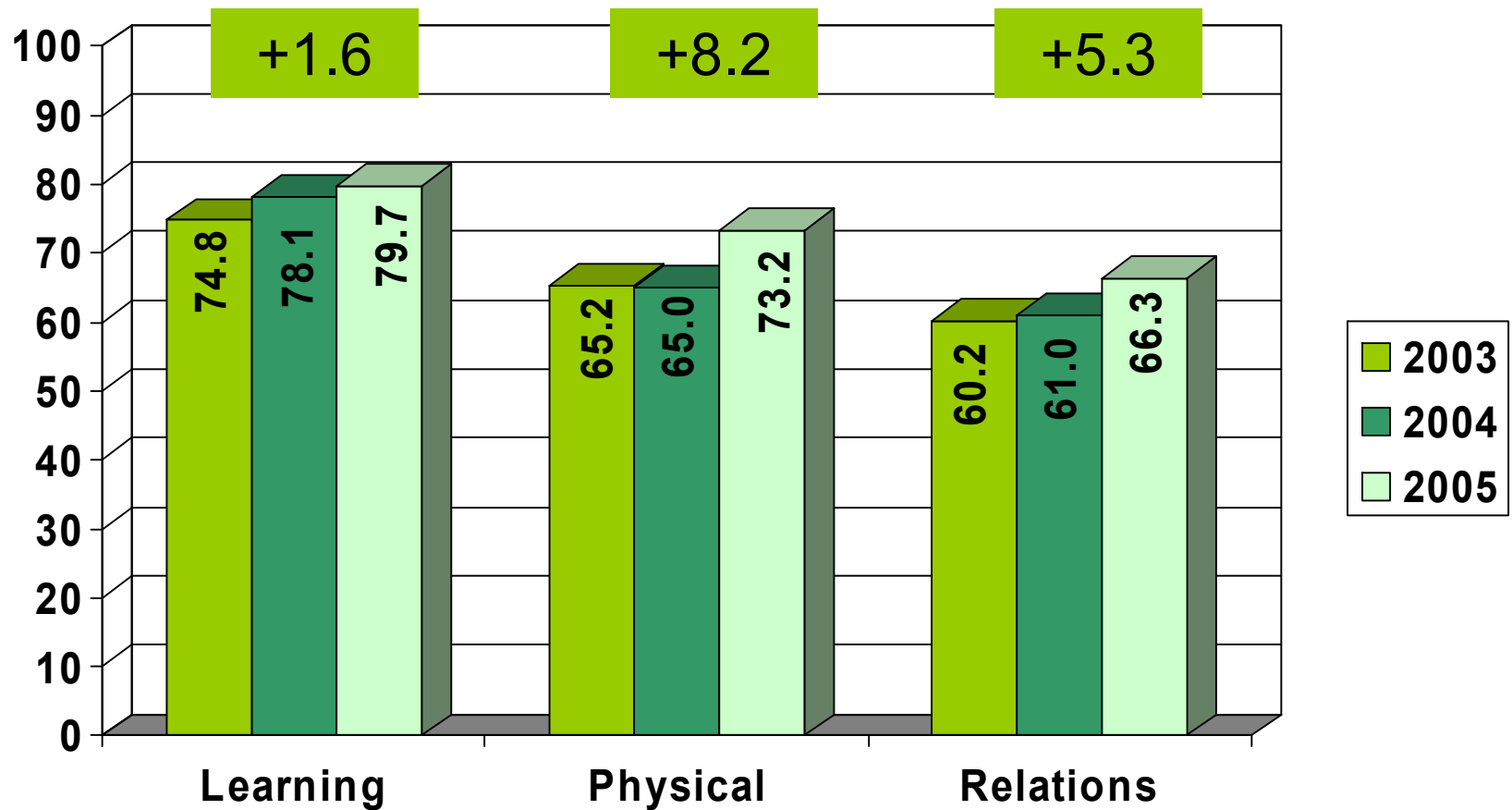
# 2005 Teacher Survey Results Middle School Level



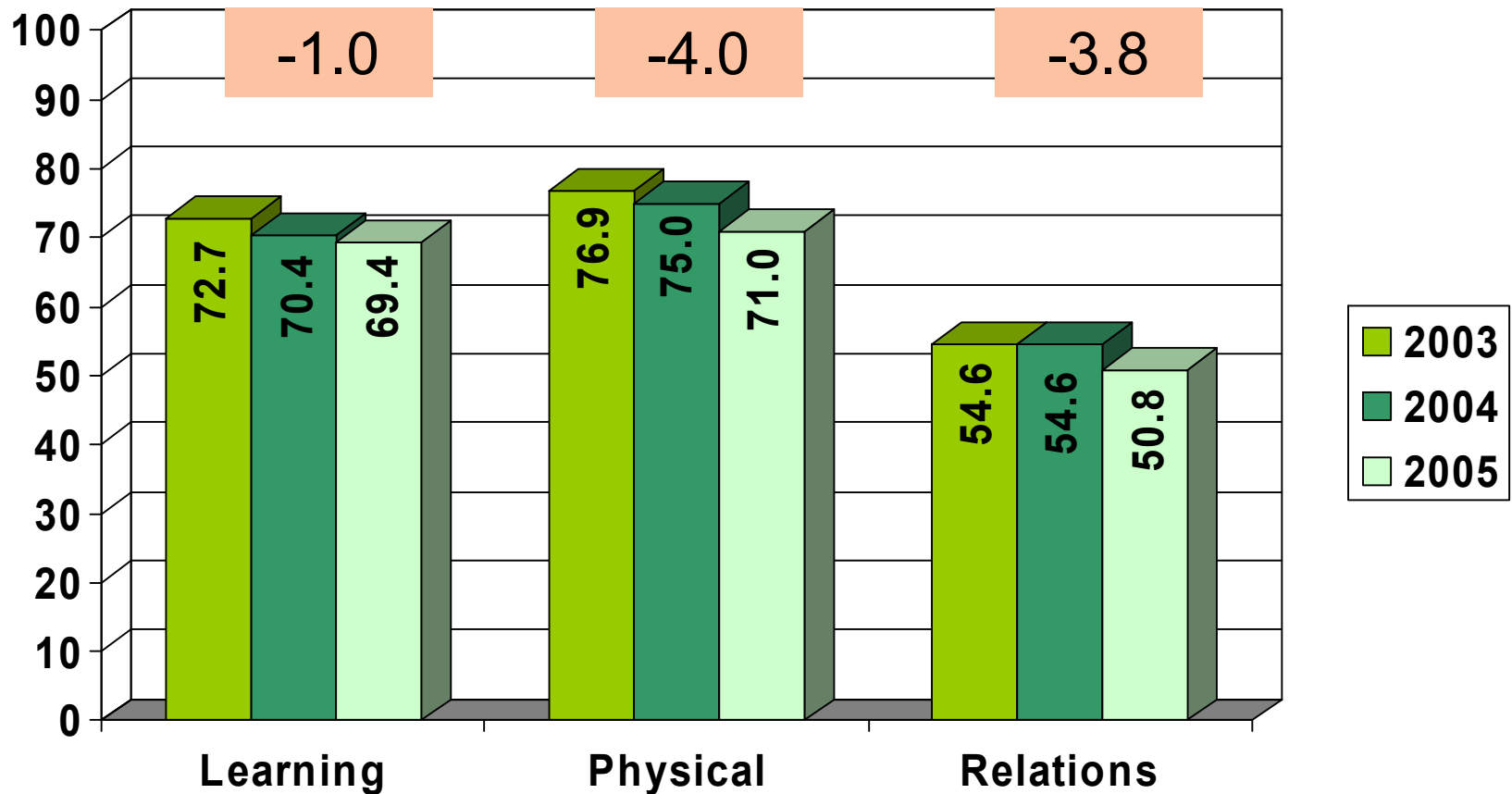

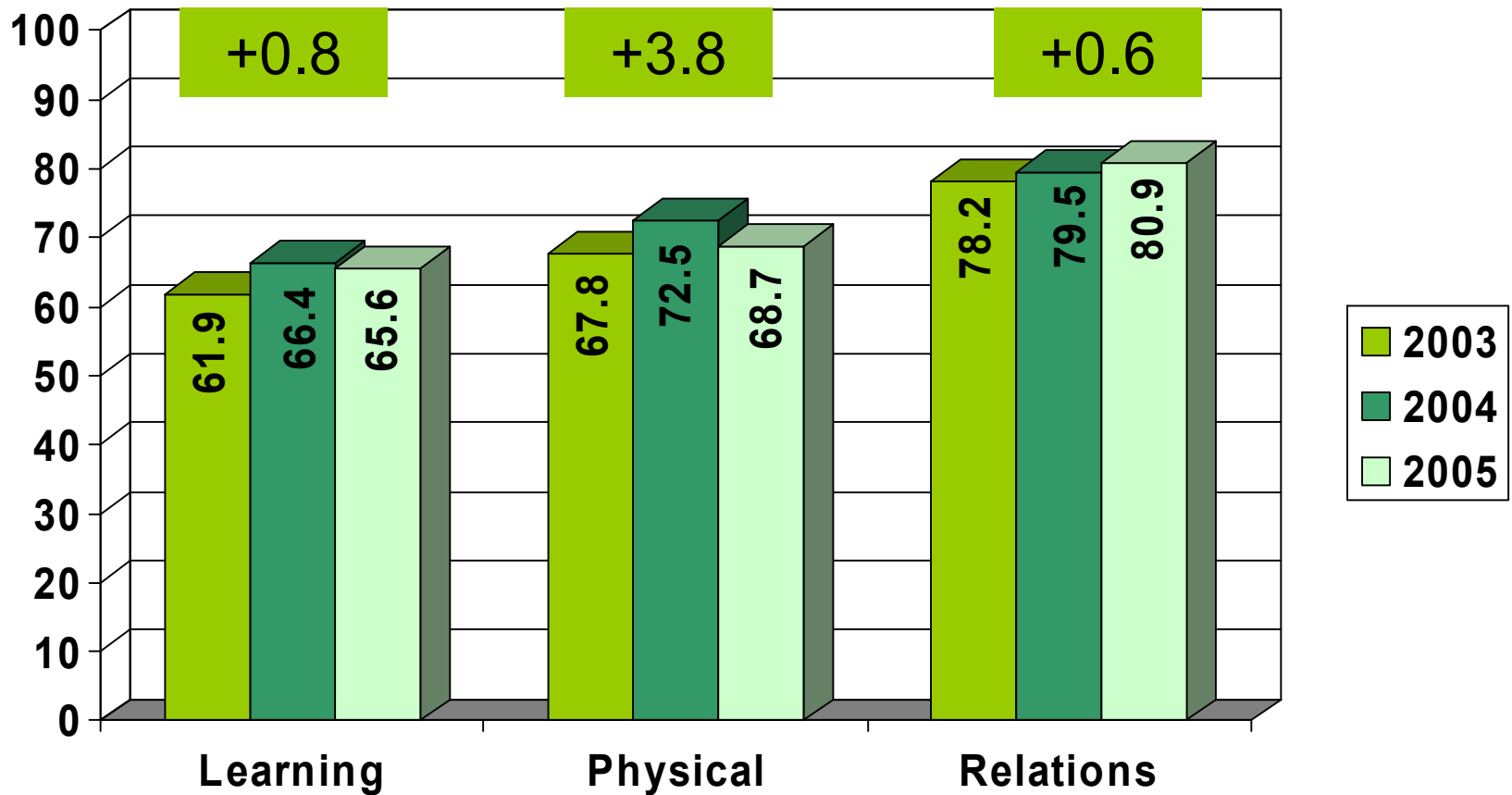

# Summary of Two-Year Results

- At elementary level, the responses of 2005, especially teacher responses, were more positive than those of 2004 except for Physical Strand of parent surveys (-1.2).
- At middle school level, the teacher and student responses of 2005 were less positive than those of 2004, especially teachers', while parent responses were more positive in 2005.
- At high school level, the parent and student responses were more positive in 2005 than 2004, especially parents' while teacher responses were less positive in 2005.

Teachers at my school focus instruction on understanding, not just memorizing facts (96.3%).</p>	<p>51. Parents participate as volunteer helpers in the school or classroom (52.3%).</p> <p>53. I AM SATISFIED WITH HOME-SCHOOL RELATIONS (57.4%).</p> <p>33. Students at my school behave well in the hallways, in the lunchrooms, and on school grounds (58.8%).</p>

The bathrooms at my school are kept clean (30.9%).</p> <p>25. Students at my school behave well in the hallways, in the lunchrooms, and on the playground (33.3%, 39.1% for high schools).</p> <p>24. Students at my school behave well in class (36.8%).</p>
