3. Student surveys contain 43 items (44 for high schools), soliciting perceptions about schools, teachers, and disciplines.

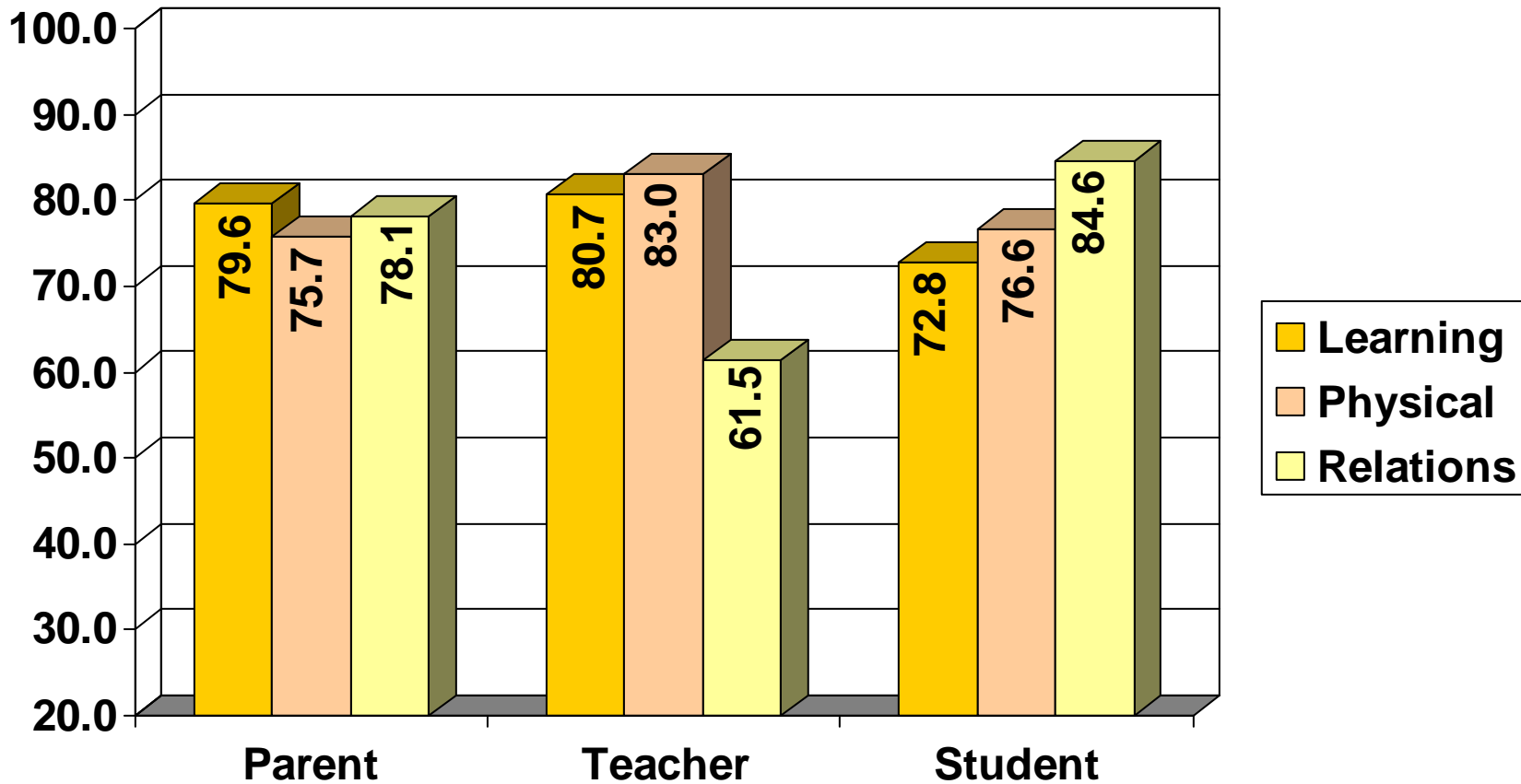
# Major Strands Among Surveys

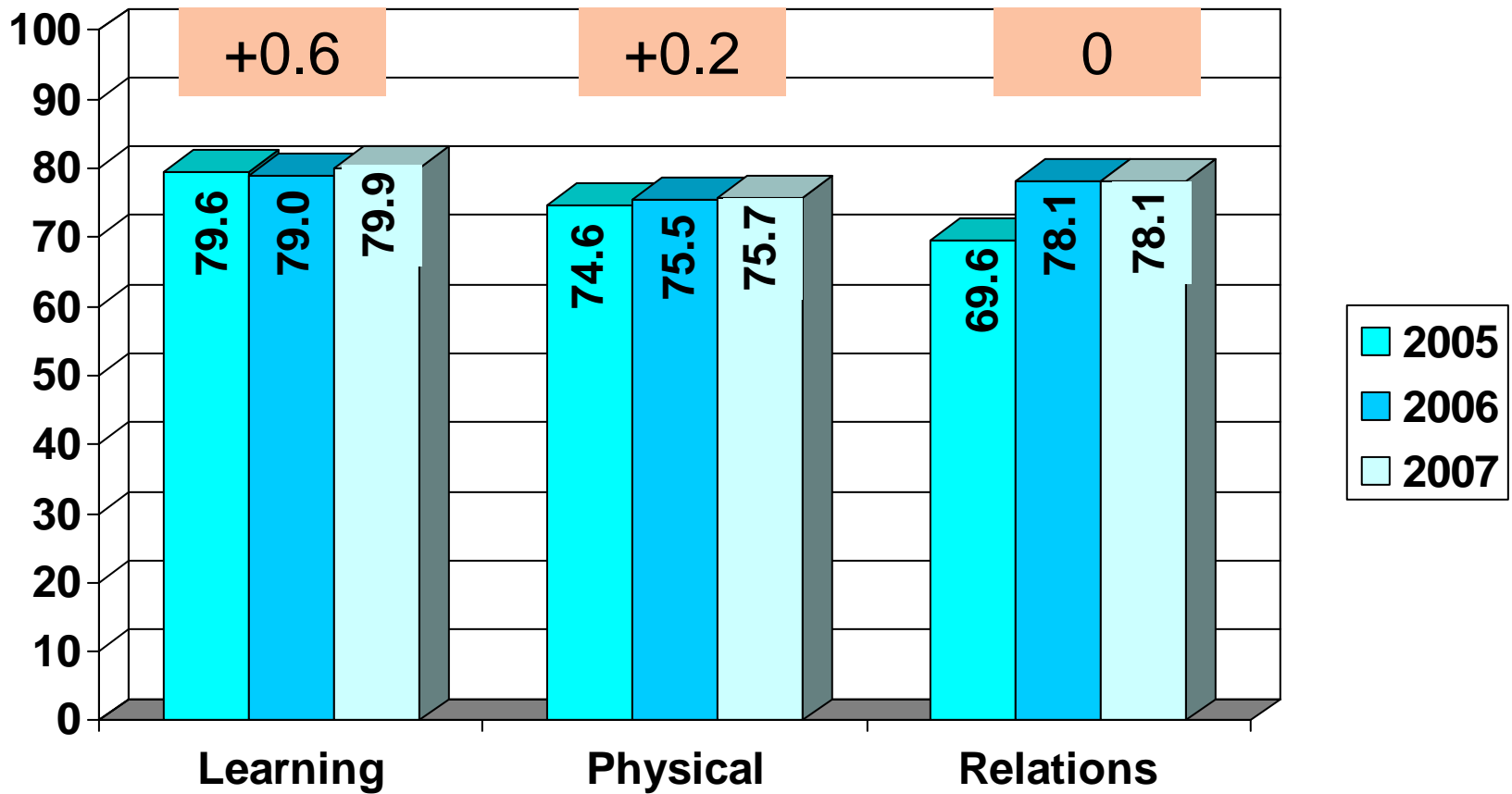

## District Level



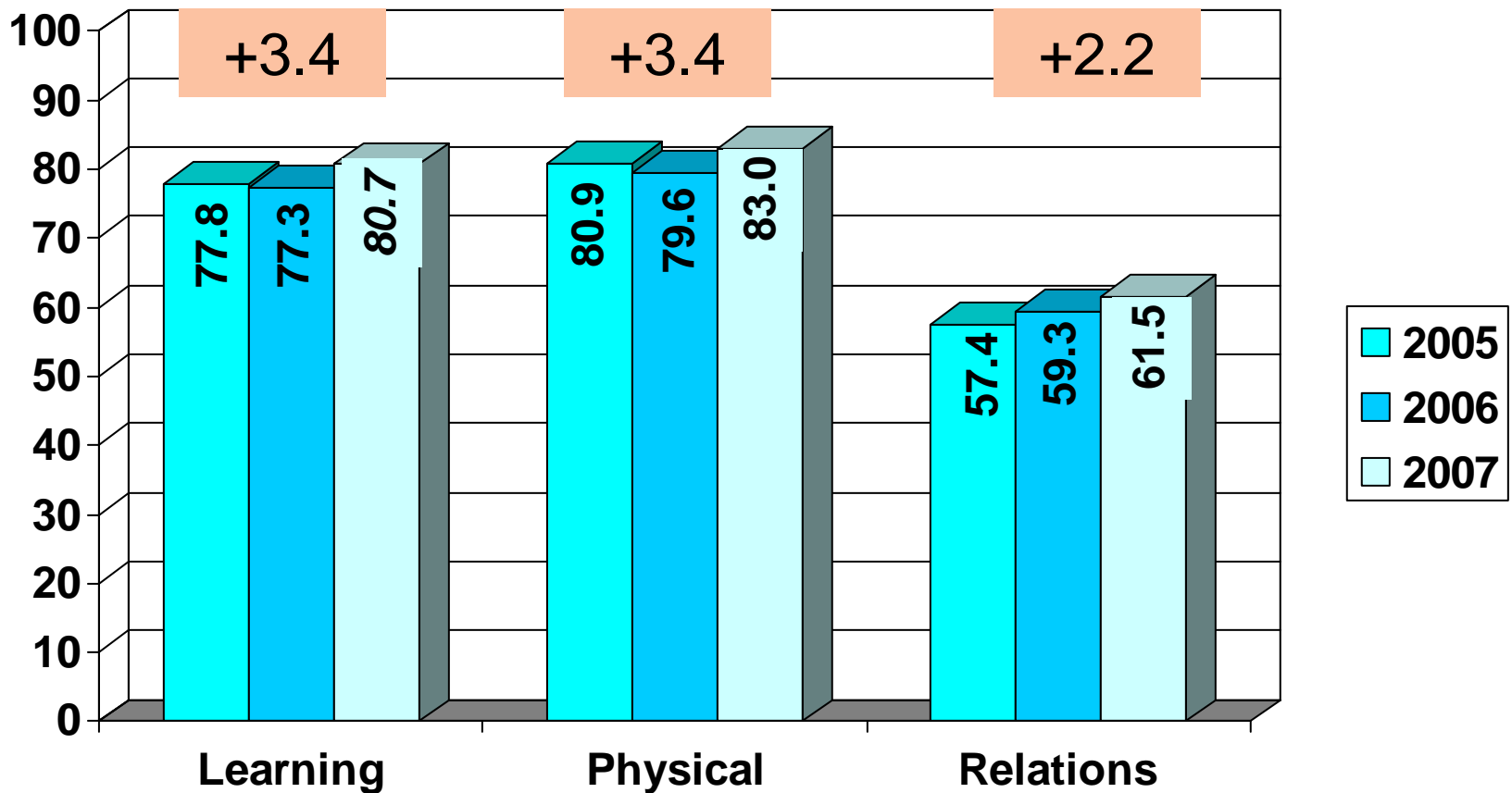
# 2007 Parent Survey Results

## District Level



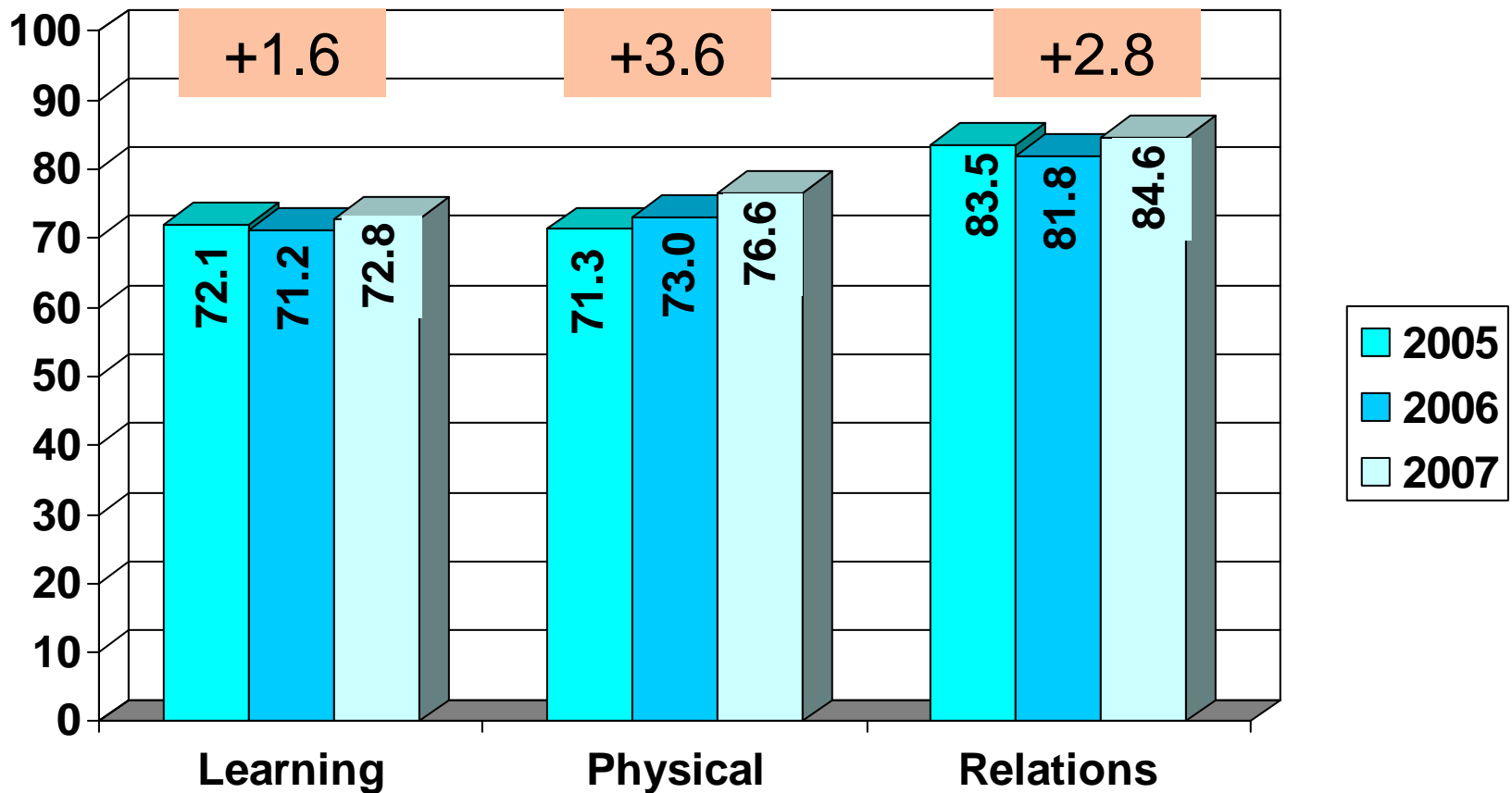
# 2007 Teacher Survey Results

# District Summary

- At least three-fourths of the Richland One parents were satisfied with all three strands.
- Over 80% of the Richland One teachers were satisfied with Learning Environment and Physical/Social Environment.
- More than four-fifths (84.6%) of the Richland One students were satisfied with Home-School Environment while at least 70% of them were satisfied with Learning and Physical/Social Environment.
- Satisfaction ratings for teachers and students increased from last year on all three areas.

# District Summary

- Parents **most satisfied** with the Learning Environment; teachers with the Physical Environment, and students with the Home-School Relations.
- Parents **least satisfied** with the Physical Environment, teachers with the Home-School Relations while students least satisfied with the Learning Environment.

## Overall Attitudes Toward Schools

- 42. The school's overall friendliness (75.7%), up from 72.5% in 2006.
- 46. How the school is doing overall (69.4%), up from 67.8 last year.
- 45. The school's efforts to give important information to parents (68.9%), up from 61.3% in 2006.
- 44. The school's efforts to get important information from parents (68.9%), up from 64.9 as last year.
- 43. The school's interest in parents' ideas and opinions (63.2%), up from 61.3% in 2006.

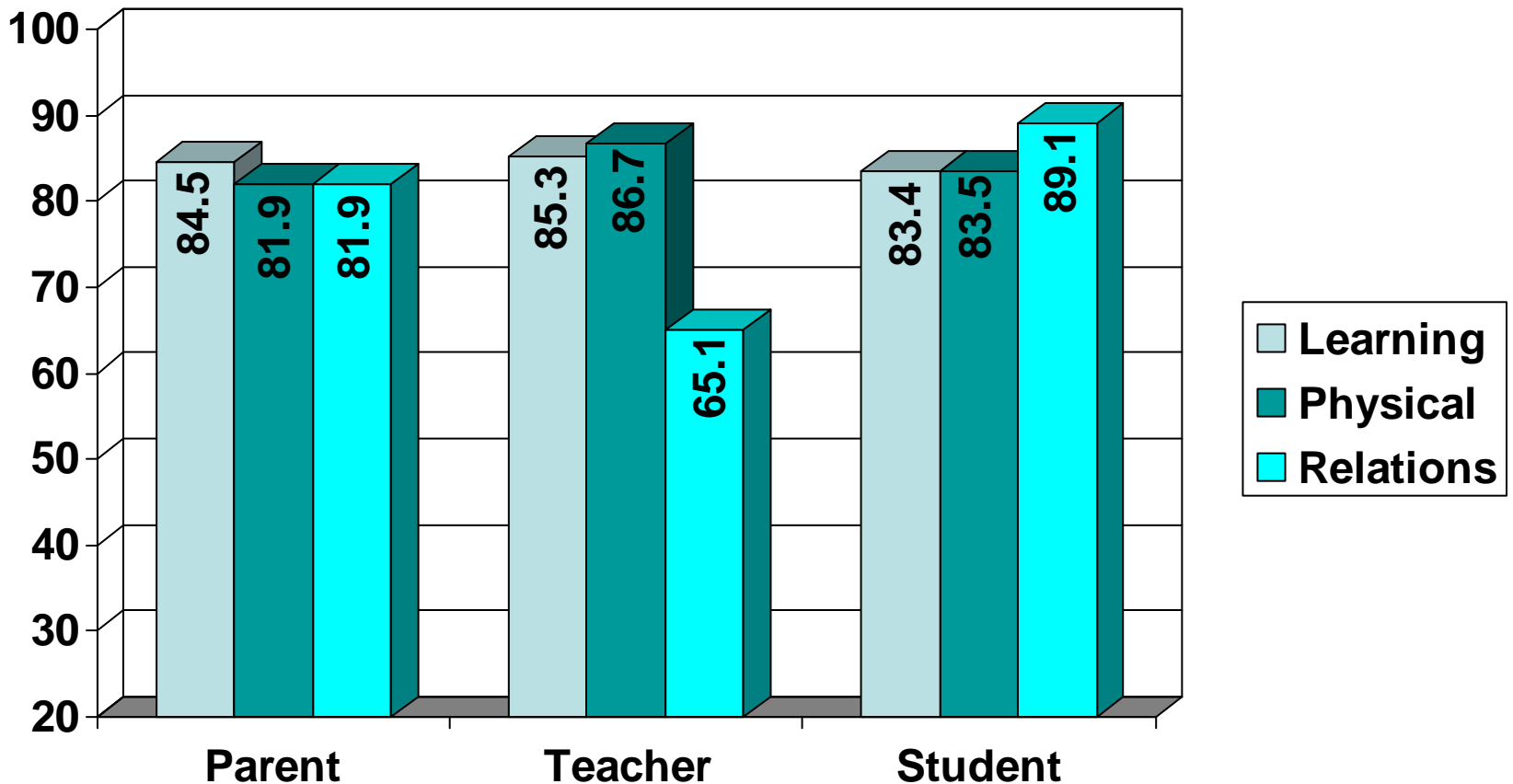

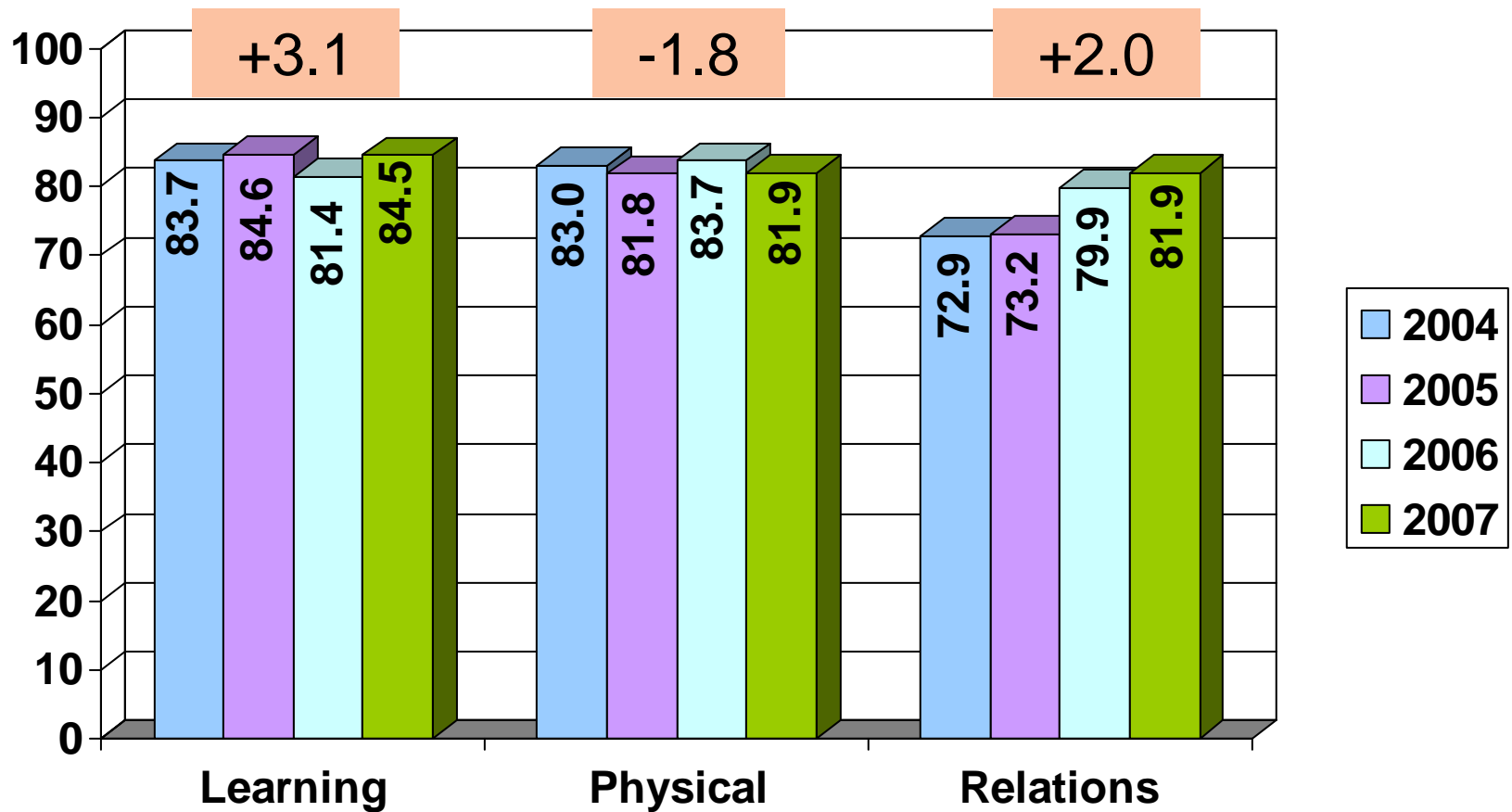

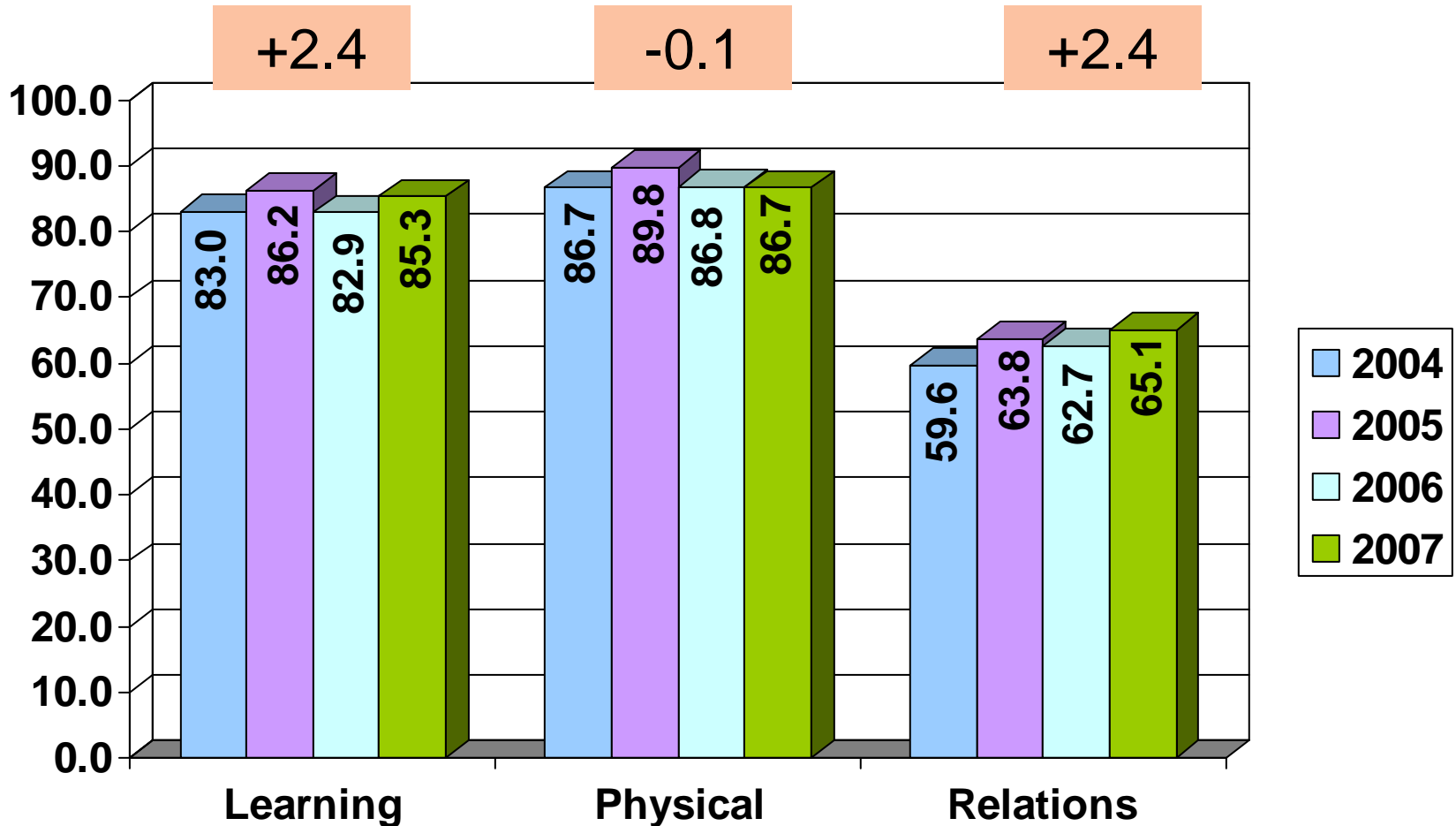
## Elementary Level



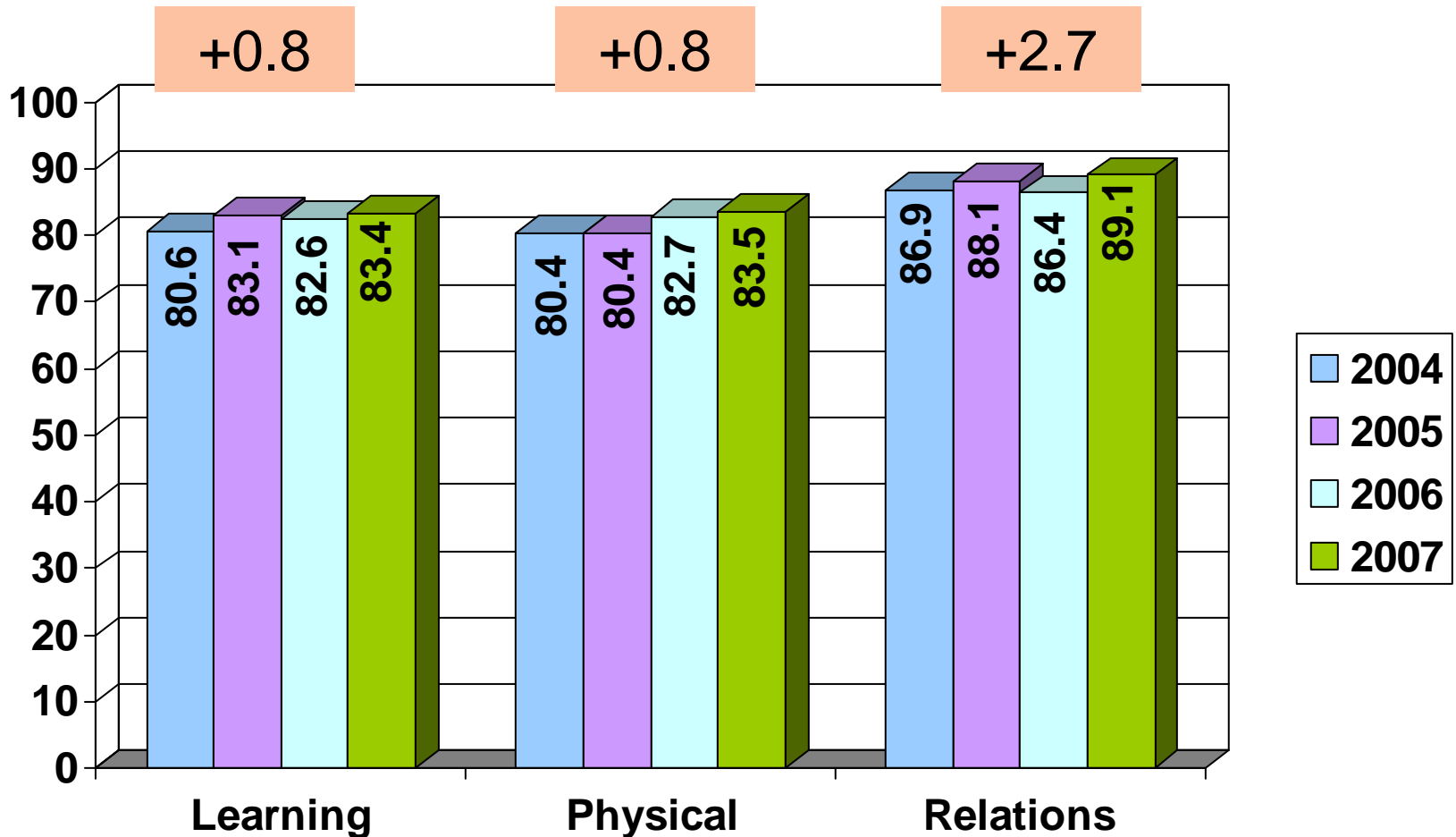
# 2007 Parent Survey Results Elementary Level



# 2007 Teacher Survey Results Elementary Level

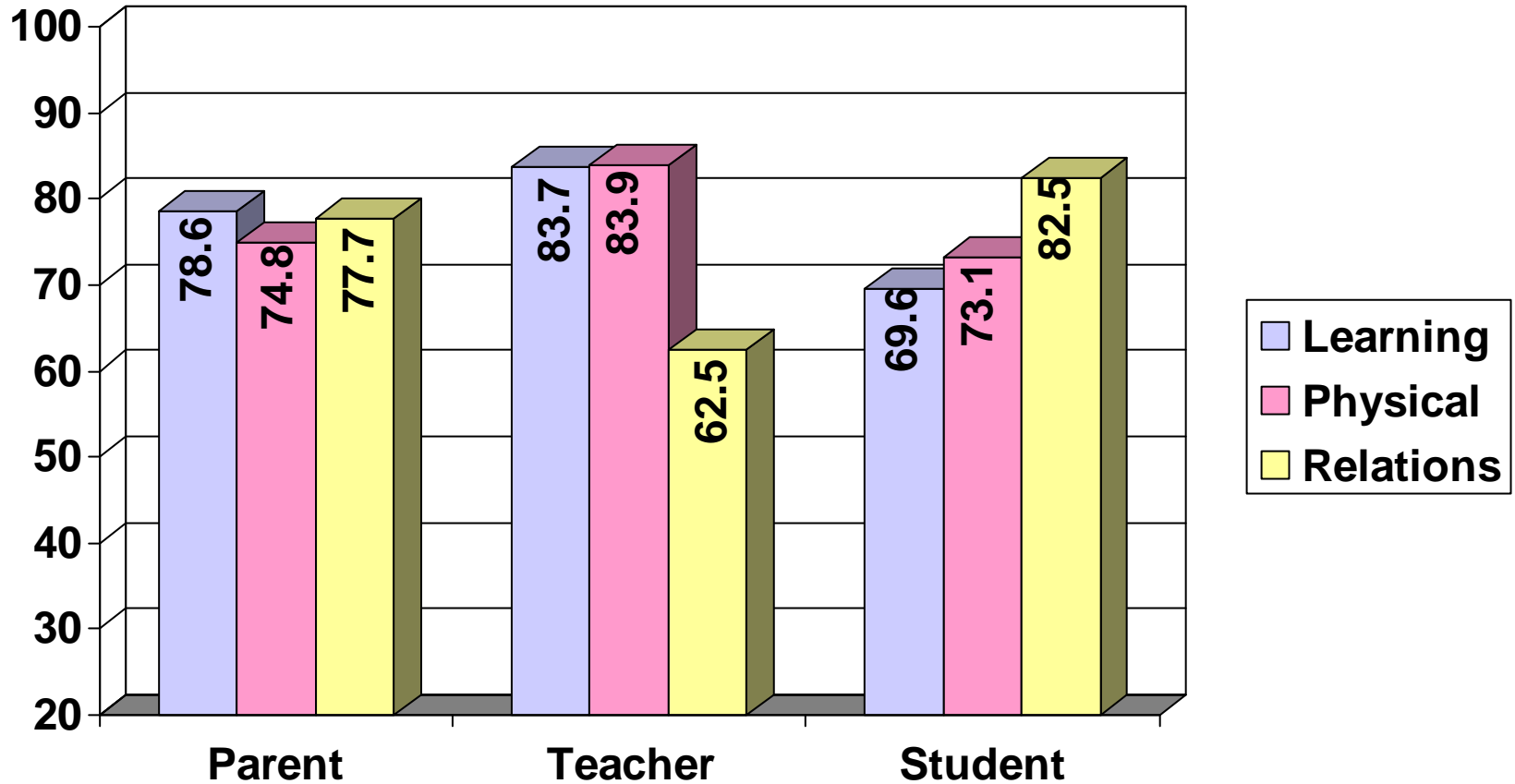


# 2007 Student Survey Results Elementary Level



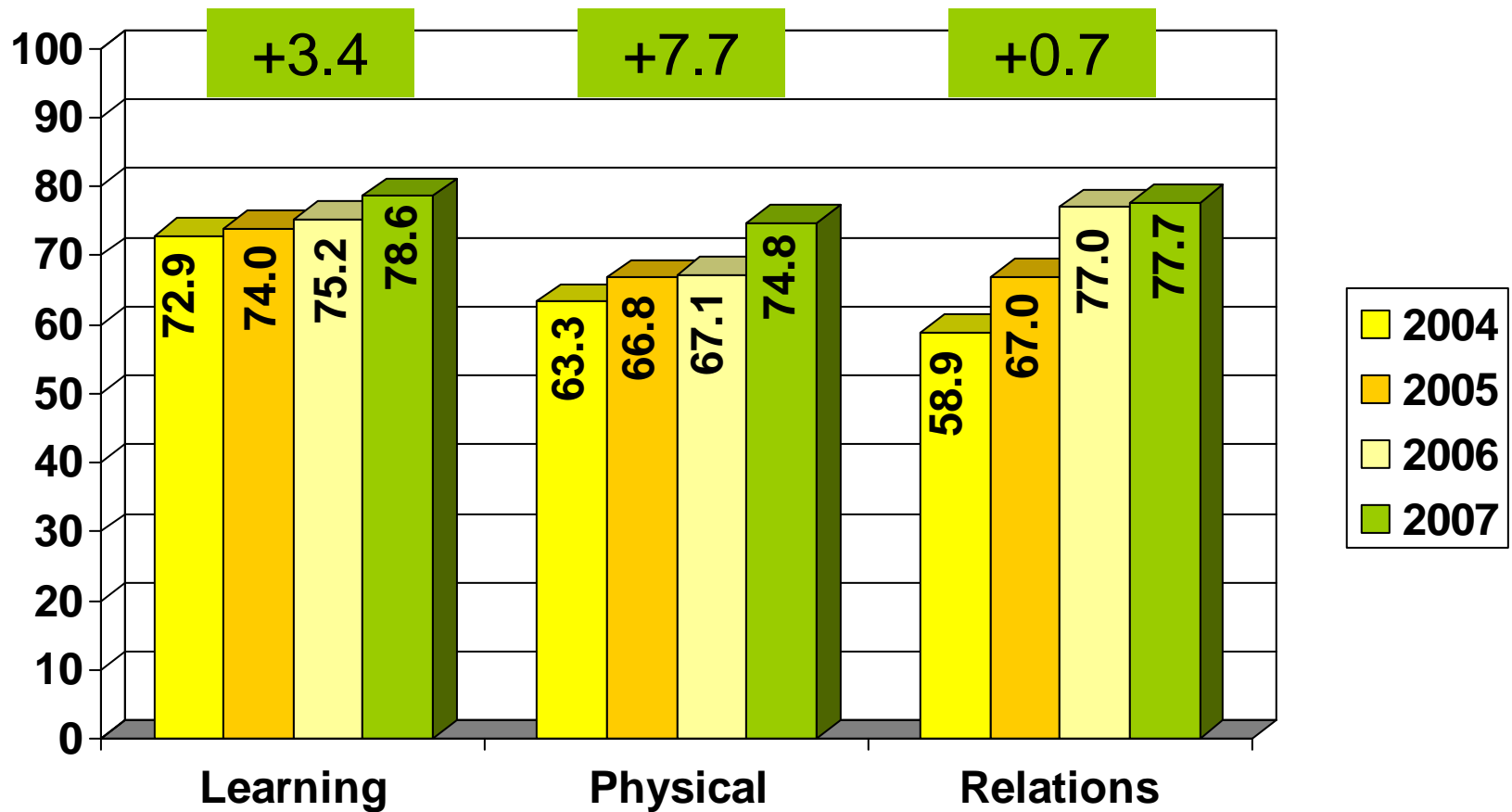

## Middle School Level



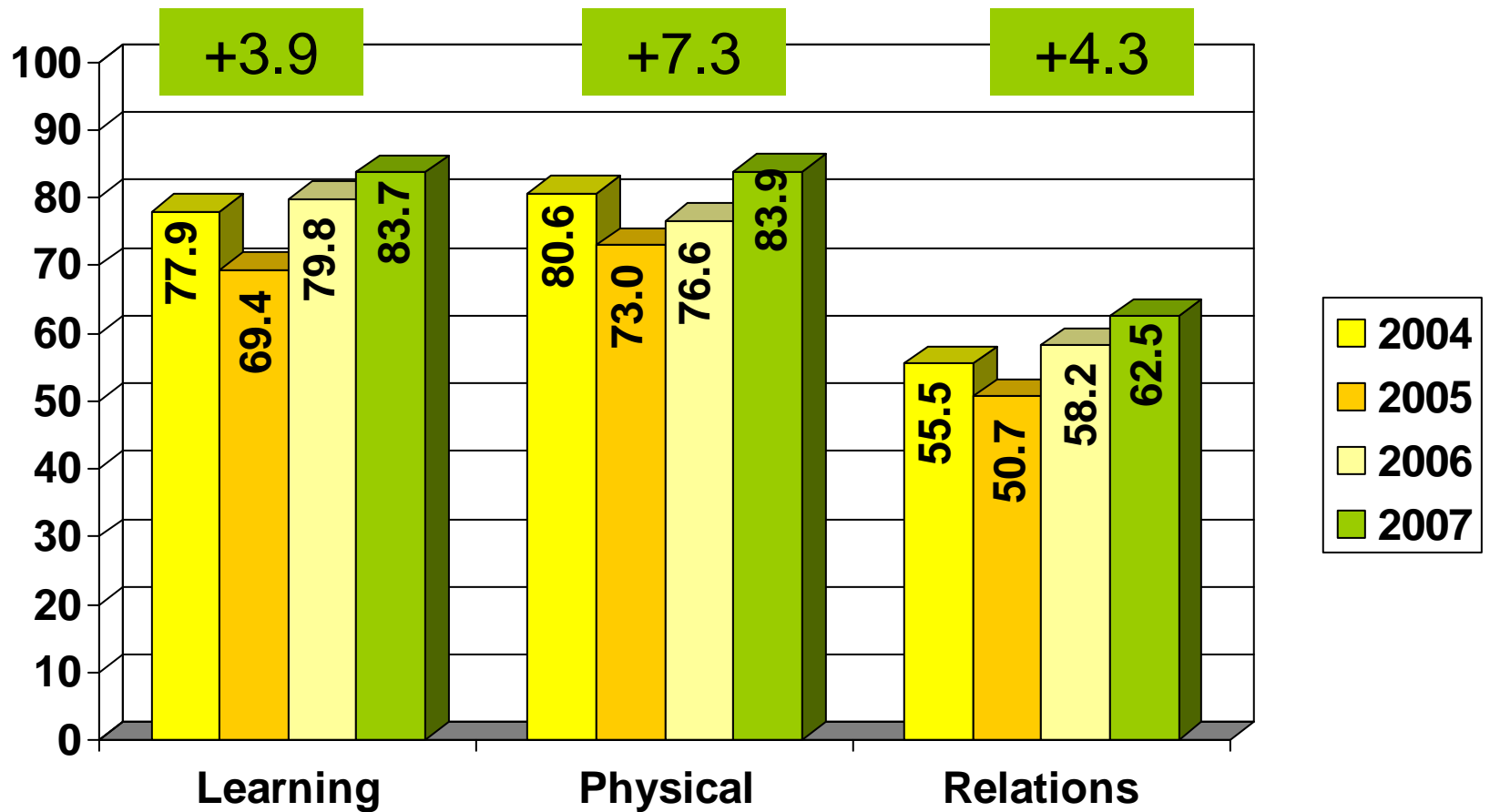

## Middle School Level

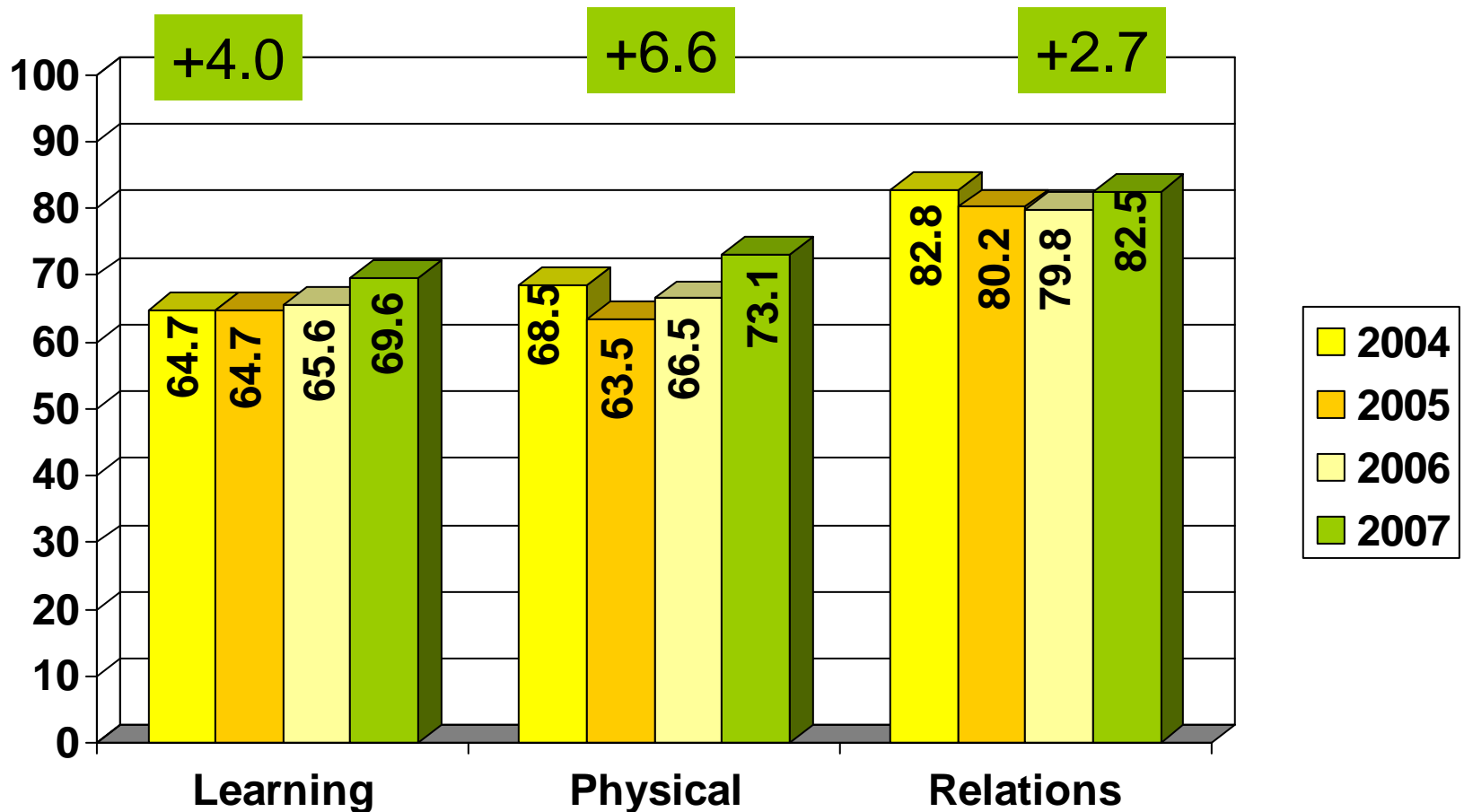

## Middle School Level

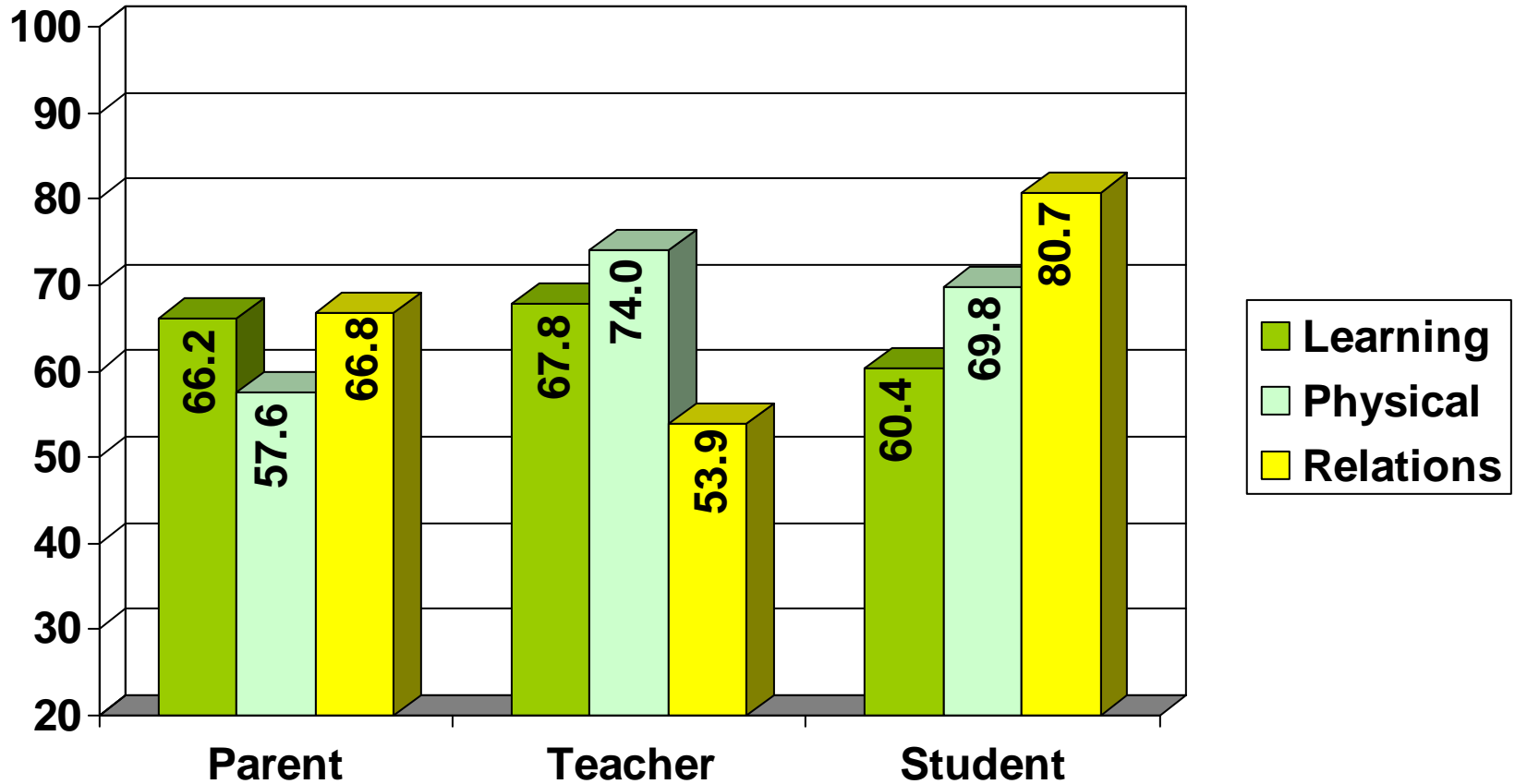


# 2007 Student Survey Results Middle School Level



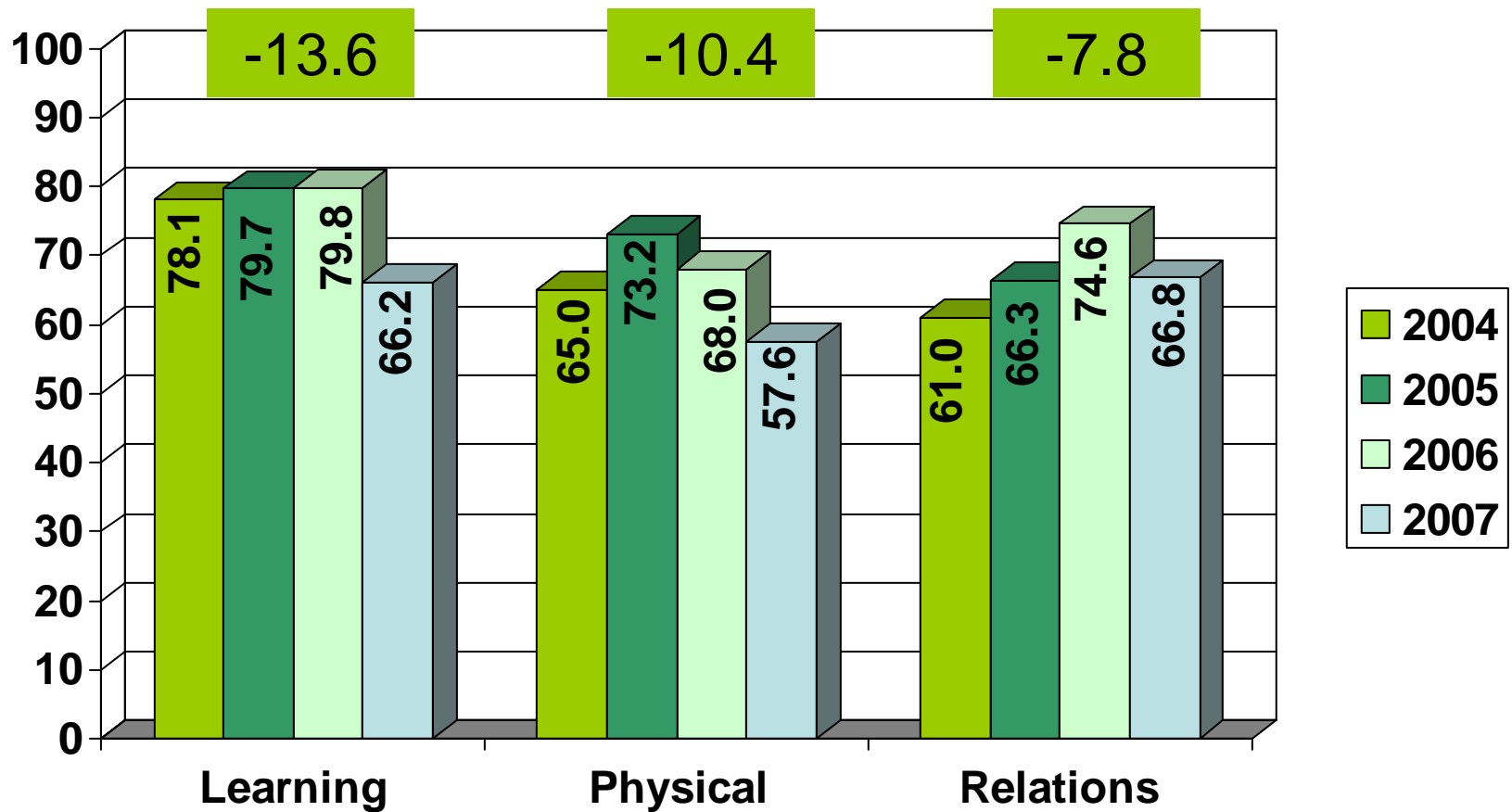

## High School Level

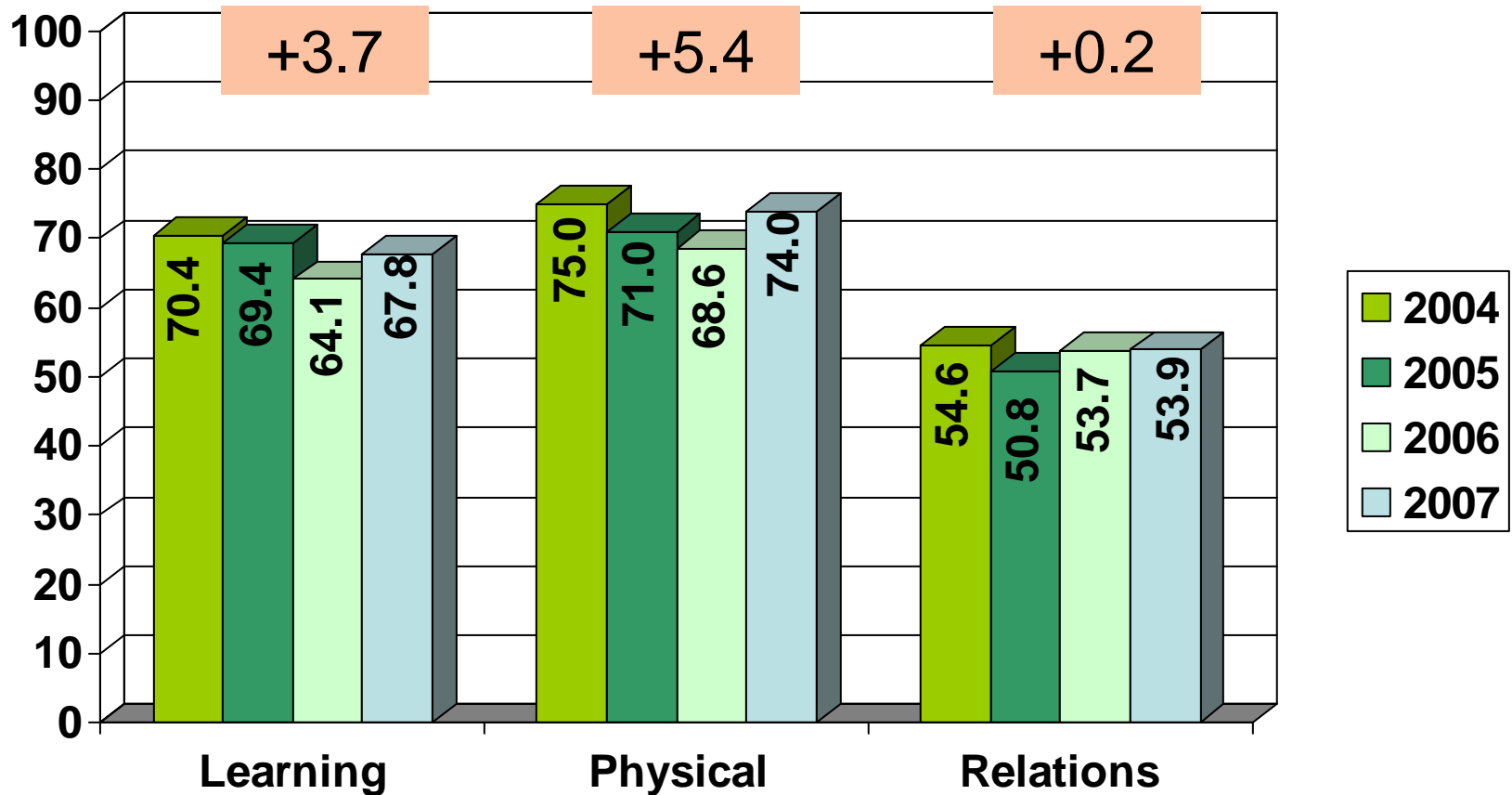

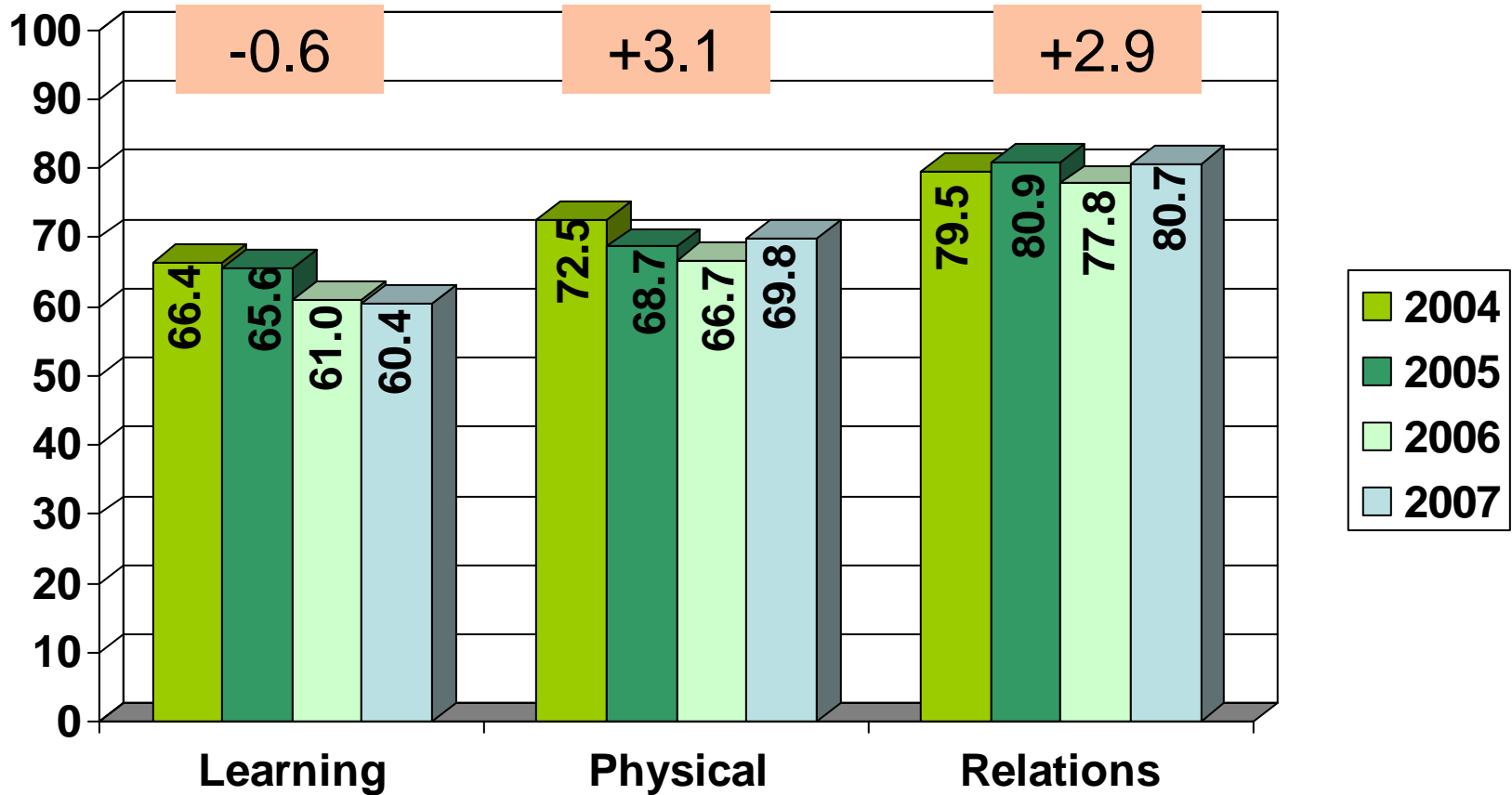

# Summary

- Elementary School Level
  - Parent Survey: Over (80%) satisfied all three areas
  - Parent Survey: Relations (81.9%), **highest** in five years
  - Student Survey: **Highest** percent satisfied in all three areas the past four years
  - Teacher Survey: Increase of (2.4%) satisfied in “Learning & Home-School Relations” compared to 2006

# Summary

- Middle School Level
  - Parent Survey: Learning (78.6%), **highest** in five years
  - Parent Survey: Physical, Increase of (77.0%) satisfied compared to 2006
  - Teacher Survey: Increase between (3.9% & 7.3%) in the three areas
  - Student Survey: Increase between 2.7% & 6.6 % in all 3 areas

# Summary

- High School Level
  - Parent Survey: Decrease 7.8% & 13.6% in all three areas
  - Parent Survey: Learning, decrease 13.6% largest change in all surveys
  - Teacher Survey: Learning (67.8%), increase from 2006, but still below percent satisfied between 2003 & 2005
  - Teacher Survey: Learning, increase of 2.7% and 5.4% in Physical
  - Student Survey: Learning (60.4%), lowest in five years and .06% down from 2006
  - Student Survey: Increase of 3.1% in Physical & 2.9% in Home-School
