



## Lockers & Cell Phone Policy

## Switching Periods & Different Teachers

### **Policies & Procedures**

As a  $6^{th}$  grader, you will report to the cafeteria in the morning, and sit with your Homeroom ( $1^{st}$  period) teacher. For lunch, you will sit with your lunch class. You are expected to transition at level zero (quietest level) during hallway transitions.
