MORNING PROCEDURES AND TRAFFIC REMINDERS

Please remember that the only available student entrance between 7:00 - 7:10 a.m. is the cafeteria entrance and is open only for students who are eating breakfast at school. All students arriving during this time should be dropped off at this location. Students should never be dropped off at the S. Ravenel entrance before 7:10 a.m.

- The back car line is for car drop off and pick up only. Parents and children should never walk up the car line. All students who are not car riders should enter and exit the campus at the appropriate areas.
- Students and parents should never walk through the faculty parking lot. Please use the designated sidewalks and walkways.
- S. Ott/Moss Please do not drop students off in this area.
- S. Ravenel/Hope Avenue One way from 7:00 a.m. 8:30 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. 3:00 p.m.
- S. Walker No parking between Rosewood and Hope Avenue.
- No parking on yellow cubs/corners or in neighbor's driveways.

ATTENDANCE RULES

- The attendance office must receive an excuse for every absence. It can be a note written by the parent or from a physician's office.
- Family trips and vacations are unexcused absences and should be scheduled around the school calendar.
- Three consecutive or five cumulative unexcused absences constitutes truancy, and an Attendance Intervention Plan must be implemented. Once an AIP is in place, a truancy petition will be filed for any additional unexcused absences.
- Any student who is not IN CLASS by 7:25 is tardy and should be signed in at the main office by an adult.
- Parents may write excuses for up to 10 absences. Any additional absences must be excused by a doctor.
- Any changes in your child's normal afternoon dismissal procedures must be sent in writing and received before 2:00 p.m. <u>Absolutely no changes will be accepted over the telephone.</u>
