*Understands that the SC READY and SCPASS tests are opportunities to show what he/she knows

*Knows that the test covers school work learned throughout the year. Extra study time is not required for the test)

*Is reassured about the test-taking experience. Students who are calm do better on tests)

Students will not be allowed to have any electronic devices except their school issued testing devices and necessary medical devices during testing. Electronic devices, including Smartwatches, cellphones, calculators, etc. will collected by the teacher prior to testing

Please make sure that your child is on time for school on test days. This means students need to ARRIVE at school by 7:25 a.m.
