The Department of Education awarded Dreher two "Cum Laude Achievement" designations for excellence in performance on both the SAT and ACT.

Dreher was named on Newsweek's List of America's Best High Schools.

The Department of Education awarded Dreher a Palmetto Gold Award for General Performance for the second consecutive year.

Out of the senior class of 221, forty-one students were named 2014 High School Scholars and/or Richland One Academic All-Stars.



Four dozen seniors scored 1100 or higher on SAT or 24 or higher on ACT to meet one qualification for the **Life Scholarship.**

Seventeen seniors were candidates for the Palmetto Fellows Scholarship.

In May 2014, 236 students gook 446 AP exams and **73.3%** scored a 3 or higher.

Nine seniors were named AP Scholars with Distinction, seven were AP Scholars with Honor and twelve were AP Scholars.

Achievement in Academics

Three students made a **perfect score** on portions of the **PSAT**, three made a **perfect score** on portions of the **SAT** and one made a **perfect score** on the science portion of the **ACT**.

The State **Champion Academic Decathlon Team** represented South Carolina at the national competition in Hawaii. The team placed 13th in the nation.

In the Spring Latin competition, Dreher's team of Joseph Duffield, Isabel Gwara, Cari Tuel and Levi Walker finished first in the advanced *certamen*.

Senior **Savannah Cruel** graduated with twelve years of perfect attendance.




