Seniors' mean composite SAT scores rose 27 points. Out of the senior class of 260, forty-three students were named 2015 High School Scholars and/or Richland One Academic All-Stars.

Over five dozen seniors scored 1100 or higher on SAT or 24 or higher on ACT to meet one qualification for the Life Scholarship.



Twenty seniors were candidates for the Palmetto Fellows Scholarship.

In May 2015, 232 students took 472 AP exams.
Pass rate (score of 3 or higher) was **74.3%.**

Sixteen seniors were named AP Scholars with Distinction, five were AP Scholars with Honor and nine were AP Scholars.

the Fine Arts Institute.

Seven students made a perfect score on portions of the SAT and two made a perfect score on one or more portions of the ACT.
