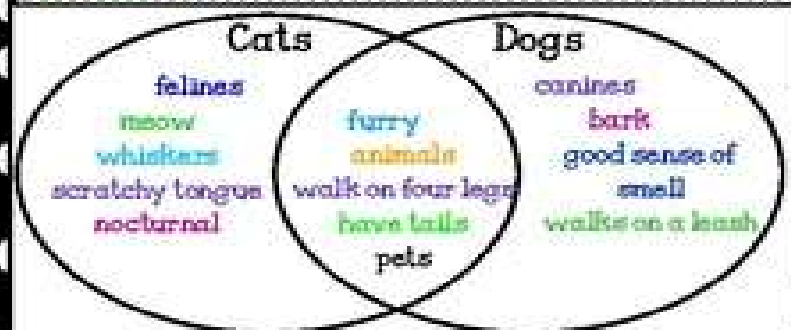
7 Syllable Types

1	Closed 	A syllable in which a single vowel is followed by a consonant. The vowel is usually short.	$\bar{v}c$	cat rab/bit nap/kin
2	Open 	A syllable ending with a single vowel. The vowel is usually long.	\bar{v}	ti/ger ba/by pa/per
3	Magic e 	A syllable with the long vowel-consonant-silent e pattern.	$\bar{v}c\bar{e}$	bake pine bone
4	Vowel Team 	A syllable containing two letters that together make one vowel sound.	$\bar{v}v'$	team float seed
5	r-controlled 	A syllable in which the vowel(s) is followed by the single letter r. The vowel sound is "controlled" by the r.	$v r$	car bird fort
6	Diphthongs 	A syllable containing two vowels in which a new vowel sound is formed by the combination of both vowel sounds.	(vv)	boil cloud look
7	Consonant -le 	An unaccented final syllable containing a consonant and -le.	$\bar{e} cle$	bub/ble sta/ple cir/cle
