DENTAL ACCESS CAROLINA

Richland School District One and Dental Access Carolina are teaming up to provide students with comprehensive dental care during school hours. Dental Access Carolina was founded by Dr. John Reese in 2001. Currently he operates six mobile clinics throughout the state at over 150 schools. The mobile clinic offers: dental exams; x-rays; cleaning and fillings during the school year.

HEALTHY PALMETTO

Richland School District One and Prism Health now offer tele-health opportunities within our school. Students with health needs may now be instantly connected to a Prism Health nurse practitioner for non-emergency needs and have prescriptions sent to the pharmacy of choice following the visit.

NUMERACY @ HOME

Remember math is EVERYWHERE and we need to talk to our students about numbers daily. A focus this year is on 'number-sense' which is a child's flexibility with numbers and their ability to do mental math. For example think about \$20, there are so many ways to make \$20. One way is 1 \$20 bill (20+0)and another way is 1 \$10 plus 2 \$5 bills (10+5+5). Talk with your child about how else to make \$20. For younger students think about ways to make a group of 5 shapes. One way is 3 triangles and 2 squares (3+2) and another way is 4 triangles and 1 square (4+1). Talk with your child about how else to make 5.
