Learning Activities or Experiences	<p>Connection:</p> <p>One of the ways an author develops his or her style is the use of dialect. Dialect is the distinctive speech patter of a particular region, class, or race. Unlike slang, dialect has a distinct and well-developed system of grammar, vocabulary, and pronunciation. Through the use of dialect, authors are able to create a realistic story, believable characters, and an authentic-feeling setting.</p> <p>In her research as an anthropologist, Zora Neal Hurston collected African-American folk tales and developed a system to convert many of these spoken tales to a written form of the black dialect. How does Hurston create powerful, authentic characters and a realistic setting?</p>

Learning Activities or Experiences	<p>Connection:</p> <p>In life most of us have to face hardship and difficulty, but in the end we have to know how to play the hand that we are dealt. In chapters 2 – 5 of the novel, the main character Janie has endured some life changing experiences which causes her to grow up early, and she realizes that she has to make some tough decisions that will not only affect her but the people in her life.</p>

Review:

- Use “The Hand We Are Dealt Chart” to analyze the different events that have taken place thus far in Janie’s life in the novel *Their Eyes Were Watching God*
- Read the first half of chapter 6 (pp. 87-97) of *Their Eyes Were Watching God*

Application:

- On “The Hand We Are Dealt Chart” I have given you six cards different cards which represents six different events that happened in Janie’s life. You need to complete ALL six cards using information from chapters 2 – 5 to assist you. Below I have provided the six “Story Events” for each card. Feel free to use them or you may have some of your own that you have chosen.

- **Janie thought she was white until she saw herself in a picture**
- **Janie marries Jody Starks**

 - Does Janie believe Joe’s actions are a display of love? Why or why not?
