



Read-ology: A Reading Technology Project

- **Choose any two novels on your reading level** (Lexile) to read. If you do not have access to a hard copy, you may check out a book online from the Richland Library at www.richlandlibrary.com (your user name is your school ID# and the password is the last four digits of your parent phone number listed on PowerSchool).
- Decide how many chapters to read each day/night and document on your reading log. Upon completion of your **first book**, begin your technology projects (See below). Re-read parts of the chapters if needed in order to complete the assignments. If have a device (tablet, cell phone, or computer) at home, you can use your school Office 365 account to access Word and Power Point. If not, use paper/ pencil to complete storyboards, rough drafts, final copies, and sketches until a computer is available to you. After reading your **second book**, complete the **same activities** listed below (Days 6-10).

<p>1st Day Tech Project – A Character Web Use www.canva.com or Microsoft Word to make a character web of all the characters from your novel. You can create pieces as you read, adding new characters as you encounter them.</p>	<p>2nd Day Tech Project – A Book Poster Make a poster about the book using Microsoft Publisher. Items can be added as you read further into the book. When completed the posters will be printed and hung in the hall/media center to encourage others to read the book. Be Creative!</p>	<p>3rd Day Tech Project – Business Cards Make a business card on Microsoft Publisher or www.canva.com that one of the characters might use. Upon completion, we will trade them with others.</p>	<p>4th Day Tech Project – Thank You Notes Take the role of the main character of your novel.
