

National Banner Unified Champion School

Crayton Middle School was named a National Banner Unified Champion School by the Special Olympics for meeting 10 standards of excellence and demonstrating a commitment to maintaining a school climate that is inclusive of all students.



Army JROTC Drill Team Champions

Lower Richland High School's Army JROTC Drill Team placed first in the Palmetto State Drill Championship (armed division) and qualified for the National High School Drill Team Championship for the second consecutive year.



Disney Dreamer

Benjamin Brown of Dreher High School was only one of 100 teens and the only South Carolina student selected to participate in the 2023 Disney Dreamers Academy. More than 8,000 high school students applied for the four-day educational mentoring program for future leaders.



McDonald's All-American

MiLaysia Fulwiley of W.J. Keenan High School was named a 2023 McDonald's All-American, the only South Carolina player selected this year and only the sixth girls basketball player from South Carolina ever chosen for the all-star game.



J-100 AFJROTC Scholarship Recipient

Columbia High School Air Force JROTC Cadet Lucas Wright was one of 100 cadets worldwide selected to receive the J-100 AFJROTC Character-in-Leadership Scholarship, which provides four years of 100% paid college tuition.



Young Men United

The United Way of the Midlands announced its Young Men United pilot program, a workforce development initiative sponsored by Colonial Life, targeting young men of color in 10th and 11th grades with mentorship, paid internships and professional engagement to help them reach their education and career goals. Eau Claire High School was selected to be one of the first schools to participate in the program.



R1 CHAMPS

Richland One launched a new initiative called R1 CHAMPS (Caring Hearts Making Positive Shifts) with the goal of placing more positive adult role models on school campuses. The volunteers greet students, monitor the halls during class changes, assist staff with activities and encourage students to do their best. R1 CHAMPS began with male volunteers and will expand to include female volunteers in 2023-2024.



Future Educator Signing Day

In partnership with the South Carolina Education Association (SCEA), Richland One recognized 22 high school seniors during the district's first Future Educator Signing Day. The students signed a pledge acknowledging their plans to study education in college. Every student received an offer to teach in Richland One after earning their degree.



Superintendent's Book Club Challenge

On March 2, Richland One Superintendent Dr. Craig Witherspoon challenged students in pre-kindergarten through eighth grade to read 750,000 books by May 5. If students met or exceeded that goal, Dr. Witherspoon promised that the top elementary school and middle school students would have the opportunity to dunk him in a dunk tank. Students across the district exceeded the

goal by reading 1,046,651 books!

Annie Burnside Elementary School was the top school overall in the 2023 Superintendent's Book Club Challenge. Principal Janet Campbell made good on her promise to ride a camel on the school's campus if her students met their reading goal. Burnside students read 63,722 books.



MSAP Grant

Richland One was awarded a \$14.9 million Magnet Schools Assistance Program (MSAP) grant from the U.S. Department of Education. Richland One will use the grant funds over a five-year period to implement BLAST (Building Lasting Aerospace and STEAM Trajectories) at three schools – a new school-within-a-school aerospace magnet program at Watkins-Nance Elementary School; a revised school-within-a-school aerospace magnet program at W.A. Perry Middle School; and a revised school-within-a-school national defense-themed magnet program for four academies (pre-engineering, biomedical, cybersecurity and aerospace) at Columbia High School. All Richland One students are eligible to apply for the programs, which will begin in August 2023.





Language Immersion Program Expansion

In 2022-2023, Richland One expanded its language immersion program from the elementary school level to the middle school level. The middle school level language immersion program, which is housed at Hand Middle School, began in August 2022 with sixth grade only. One grade will be added each year. The elementary language immersion program is housed at Carver-Lyon Elementary School. Students enrolled in the language immersion program are taught in English and one other language (Spanish, Mandarin Chinese or French).

Language Immersion Program Addition

A ribbon-cutting ceremony officially marked the opening of the language immersion program addition at Carver-Lyon Elementary School. The state-of-the-art, 21,215-square-foot addition includes 12 classrooms, an extended learning commons area, faculty office support spaces and additional parking. Two classrooms in the existing building were completely renovated to allow for the connection of the new addition.





Vince Ford Early Learning Center Groundbreaking

A groundbreaking ceremony was held for Vince Ford Early Learning Center, a 71,000-square-foot, state-of-the-art facility that will be built on Rawlinson Road in the Lower Richland community to serve children from six weeks old to five years old. The Richland One Board of School Commissioners voted to name the center in memory of longtime school board member Vince Ford, who passed away in December 2022.

Energy Project of the Year

For the third consecutive year, the Association of South Carolina Energy Managers selected Richland One as the recipient of the Energy Project of the Year award. The 2023 award recognizes the district for installing solar panels on 15 school campuses. The solar power project is estimated to save \$1.4 million in energy costs annually. Richland One also was recognized as a 2022 Solar Champion by the South Carolina Solar Council.



Excellence in Financial Reporting and Accounting

Richland One received the highest honors in financial reporting and accounting from the Government Finance Officers Association and the Association of School Business Officials International for the Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR) for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2021. This is the 34th consecutive year the district has received this highest form of recognition in the area of governmental accounting and financial reporting.
