Note 3: Due to COVID-19, PASS was not administered in 2020.

Note 4: In 2019, Science was administered to grades 4, 6, and 8, and Social Studies was administered to grades 5 and 7. In 2021, Science was administered in grades 4 and 6 only, and Social Studies was not administered.

Note 5: Per SCDE, districts and schools should use caution in interpretation of assessment results for this school year (2020-2021) due to testing conditions as a result of the pandemic. Results should not be interpreted in the same way as results from other school years. While the administration of this test is state mandated, some families did not feel comfortable bringing their child in for testing. When participation rates are low, the summary results may not be representative of the district or school populations.
