





Note 1: AP exam scores range from 1 to 5 where passing is 3, 4, and 5. In the change columns, green indicates an increase, red indicates a decrease and yellow indicates no change. Note that the number/percent of exams passed is different than the number/percent of students who passed an exam because students can take multiple exams.





Note 2: Data may differ slightly from State Department of Education data due to the district exclusion of students who did not attend a Richland One school who are incorrectly included in the AP data or attributing the student to the correct school of enrollment.

Note 3: Due to COVID-19, the 2020 administration of the AP assessment was done virtually.

Note 4: Per SCDE, districts and schools should use caution in interpretation of assessment results for the 2020-21 school year due to testing conditions as a result of the pandemic. Results should not be interpreted in the same way as results from other school years. While the administration of this test is state mandated, some families did not feel comfortable bringing their child in for testing. When participation rates are low, the summary results may not be representative of the district or school populations.
