There are several ways that you can help your child during the testing period. Make sure that your child:

- gets a good night's sleep before testing.
- has a good (not too heavy) breakfast on the morning of testing.
- understands that the SC READY and SCPASS tests are opportunities to show what he/she knows
- knows that the test covers school work learned throughout the year (extra study time is not required for the test).
- is reassured about the test-taking experience (students who are calm do better on tests).

Please make sure that your child is on time for school on test days. This means students need to arrive at school BEFORE 7:25 a.m.! Students who are tardy will not be allowed to enter their classrooms once testing has started.

2018-19 Returning Student Enrollment Verification process will begin on May 1, 2018.

Please consider volunteering to be a testing monitor. Your duties would include escorting students to the restroom or the nurse, passing out snacks, and supervising students when the teacher returns testing materials. Please return this form to your child's home base teacher.

All parents will be required to login to their Parent Portal account to register for the upcoming school year. Kindergarten access letters will be mailed to parents soon.

WHAT IS ERIN'S LAW?

Erin's Law is named after childhood sexual assault survivor, author, speaker and activist Erin Merryn. The bill was named "Erin's Law" after her by legislators in her home state of Illinois and it has caught on nationwide. Illinois is the first state by law to mandate Erin's Law. South Carolina was the 16th state to pass Erin's Law on June 5, 2014. "Erin's Law" requires that all public schools in each state implement a prevention-oriented child sexual abuse program which teaches:

1. Students in grades PreK – 12th grade, age-appropriate techniques to recognize child sexual abuse and tell a trusted adult.
2. School personnel all about child sexual abuse.
3. Parents and guardians the warning signs of child sexual abuse, plus needed assistance, referral or resource information to support sexually abused children and their families.
