Attendance

Dear Parents/Guardians.

We want to ensure that you are well-informed about the South Carolina Compulsory Attendance law, which plays a crucial role in your child's education. Here are some key points to keep in mind: (This information is located on district and state sites)

- 1. The South Carolina Compulsory Attendance law **SECTION 59-65-10** requires that a child attend school from the school year in which the child is five (5) years old before September 1st until the child is seventeen (17) years old.
- 2. A child, at least six (6) years old but not yet seventeen (17), who has three unexcused absences in a row or a total of five unexcused absences at any point in the school year is truant and in violation of the South Carolina Compulsory School Attendance Law.
- 3. The law also states that once a child is found to be truant, the parent/guardian must work with the school to develop an attendance plan.
- 4. Anytime a student is absent, the parent or guardian must provide a written note to the school explaining the absence within **48 hours** (**Two** (**2**) **days**) of the child returning to school.
- 5. Students may be referred to the school social worker or other support service staff for excessive excused/unexcused absences.
- 6. Parents also can check their child's attendance by logging into the Parent Portal.

Attendance Recovery: State law requires a minimum of 120 hours (about 5 days) of seat time for a one-credit course and 60 hours (about 2 and a half days) for half-credit courses. Any student who accumulates more than five (5) absences in a semester (0.5 credit) course, more than ten (10) absences in a year-long (1.0 credit) course, or twenty (20) absences in a 2.0 credit course is in jeopardy of not receiving credit and may instead be assigned a "Failure due to Absence (FA).

New Policy for FAs: Richland One will ONLY allow students to recover missed days not to exceed 6 days in a 1 credit course and 3 days in a 0.5 credit course.
