SEAT TIME RECOVERY

Regular school attendance is important to the academic success of every student. State law mandates that students may not have more than 10 absences in 1.0 credit courses and 5 absences in half credit courses. Absences above this violate the SC Compulsory Attendance Law and puts the student in danger of losing credit.

Once a student exceeds the maximum amount of allowable absences, they will need to complete seat time hours to restore their credit. Incomplete hours will result in a loss of credit and may require retaking the course and can also alter a student's grade classification.

Students that receive a (FA) Failure due to Absences must make up required seat time. All requirements must be completed prior to the beginning of the next school year

Seat Time Recovery for attendance is offered to high school students and will begin Monday, January 9, 2023 for semester 1 half credit (.5) courses and full credit classes, ending February 15, 2023. Afterwards, the next available date for seat time for semester 2 and yearlong classes will be summer school 2023.

It is the student's responsibility to complete all assigned modules during the allotted time. There is no cost to completing seat time.

If the assigned modules are not completed and all seat time completed, the FA could remain indefinitely on the transcript, which the student will be required to retake the course through credit recovery or initial credit via classroom or Edgenutiy.

Process to complete seat time hours at Lower Richland High School are as follow:

- Students must obtain, complete and return a seat time registration form that must be signed by the student, parent/guardian, and the school counselor. Ms. Alfreda Lucas and Mrs. Tamahra Pringle, are seat time advisors.
- Seat time will be held Mondays-Thursday 3:15 – 5:00 pm and Saturdays 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m in the cafeteria.
